There was no board meeting held in January. February's meeting will be held January 31st.

Notes and Such...

On Saturday, January 15th we had round one of the <u>SIR SCCA Winter Challenge</u> at Diamond Lanes South Bowling Alley. 12 bowlers showed up to test their skills on the lanes. Practice commenced at 1:30 and after a few minutes of forming excuses, competition began. Julie Seeber, Glenn Deno, Bob Sonntag and Paul Dornburg led off with strikes, Jim Lee and Kyle Nichter spared while Gene Young, Jim Sutton, Carolyn Dornburg, Tim Green, Cathy Heck and Gary Heck all opened. At the end of the first game Glenn Deno had a 231 for the high men's game and Carolyn Dornburg had a 148 for the high lady's game. Only Gary was able to strike in the first frame of the second game while Jim Sutton, Bob, Paul and Glenn spared. Deductive reasoning will tell you what the others did. Paul bowled a 212 to be the high bowler of game two while Julie Seeber had a 139 to lead the Ladies. Striking in frame one of game three were Kyle Nichter and Jim Lane. Carolyn, Tim and Paul all spared their first frame and the un-named opened. Jim Lee had the male high game of 182 while Carolyn had a nice 161. Round two will be February 12th in Evansville at Willow Lanes. We will have the lanes for two hours, 1:30 to 3:30 so get there in time to get setup. Cost for this round is \$45 per lane for two hours so if there are four bowlers on each lane the costs will be \$11.25 per bowler. I hope to see a strong contingent of SIR bowlers on hand. Please contact Bob Sonntag or Paul Dornburg and let them know if you will be participating.

The 2005 schedule of events is included in this issue and shows events through June of this year. Some of the events are tentative but most are accurate. Expect a variance of a week at most for any changes.

The first Rally will be held February 6th and will be a Bingo Rally put on by John Coen. What is a Bingo Rally? You will be given a bingo type card which requires that you take pictures of select items to meet the requirements of that square. The items may be a certain location (example – city limit sign of Owensville, Indiana), something that you may encounter randomly (example – a motor home towing a car), or something that may take some ingenuity on your part (example – a girl in a bathing suit). Each crew will pick its own route in an attempt to gain the highest score.

Starting point will be the Subway at the Pilot truck stop just north of the intersection of Interstate 64 and US Route 41. End of the rally will be at the Quality Inn which is just across Route 41 and slightly south of the start.

Registration and tech inspection will be at 12:30 CST. Cars out at 1:30. Running time will be two hours.

Leave your stopwatches and calculators at home. However, each crew will need a digital or Polaroid camera. If you can't find one come anyway. Someone will have an extra.

A map covering a 60 mile radius of the start would be a good idea.

All photos must be taken during the time of the rally and they must be original pictures, no photos of photos, nothing from the internet. Unless specifically stated otherwise all pictures that require a person to be involved must be of a person that is not a participant of this rally. Each car can have any number of people in the crew, from one to four or more.

Rally Review

Our 2004 Rally season consisted of eight events held over 10 months. Besides the typical Time-Distance-Speed type rallies there were two fun type rallies.

The first rally was put on by Bob Sonntag assisted by Terry Davis and took the teams through northwestern Kentucky. In the "A" class the winners were Chris and Carrie Moore. Gary and Cathy Heck took the honors in "B" class while Darrin and Teresa Bailey took the guest trophy.

The first "fun" rally included a TSD event as well as a food drive for the University of Southern Indiana's Archibald food closet. Some very creative purchasing allowed the trophy to end up in the hands of the Ken Andrew/Paul Dornburg team although they finished second in the timed event to Terry Davis/Bob Sonntag team in the "A" class. Glen and Georgiana Wior took home the gold in the "B" class while Team Montgomery took the win in the Guest class.

The Heck's put on the third Rally and Team Moore took first in "A" class while Glen and Georgiana Wior took the win in "B" class. Guest class winners were the students, Kathryn Birdwell and Jenny Christian. The Hecks rallied the seven cars through southern Indiana from Evansville to Reo and back.

Rally Four was put on by Paul Dornburg and Ken Andrew and toured eastern Daviess County in Kentucky from one DQ to another. Again Team Moore dominated the "A" class while Team Davis/Sonntag changed classes and took home the "B" class trophy. In the Guest class Stephan Wallace and Erin Edens were first and actually got the best score of the rally.

At this point in the Rally season Team Moore was in the lead over Team Davis/Sonntag followed by Team Heck. Team Andrew/Dornburg had participated in three of the four events and finished second every time, a pattern that was to be repeated throughout the rest of the season. The rallyists now had a two month break.

In late September Ken Andrew put on Rally Five. Team Davis/Sonntag went back to "A" class and won with an amazing score of only 29 penalty points. Jim and Darlene Cannon took first in "B" class while Team Student, Kathryn Birdwell and Jenny Christian again won the Guest class.

The Food Rally was up next and was it ever an event! The instructions could have been printed in Japanese for some of the teams as they had never seen the TV Food program to which all of the questions referred. And then when it came time to judge the results the judges had taken in too much of the fine food and liquor and could not render a decision. The final results were presented at the next club meeting and everyone that participated won a trophy of some kind. No points were awarded for this rally.

John Coen put on his first rally for our club and rallied us through south western Indiana on Halloween. Team Davis/Sonntag won "A" class by beating Team Andrew/Dornburg by less than a minute and a half. Gene Young and Mitchell Seeber won "B" class. The event ending feed was a terrific spread complete with appropriate Halloween decorations. John and Mimsie put on a terrific event on their very first try. No wonder they got the Indian Award!

The last event was put on by Terry Davis and followed a similar route used in the first Rally. Only three teams showed up for the late fall ride through Kentucky. John Coen and Frank Totten won "A" class while Nathen Eagleson and Ted Eagleson won "B" class. Because Team Moore was moving to Savannah, GA they missed this event and their chance at the Rally Trophy.

So, in the final rundown the Rally champion Team was Terry Davis and Bob Sonntag based on their four wins in the six points events they ran. The Moores could have tied for the lead had they not had to move. Team Andrew/Dornburg finished second in every Rally they participated in and garnered a tie for second place with the Moores. Let's hope that the 2005 Rally season is at least as successful as the 2004 version and then some.
