June Report

We follow the Heritage Hills autocross up with our membership meeting. The May membership meeting was held at the Evansville Pasta Grill. Notes and Such...

The SCCA Solo Nationals and the SCCA Road Racing Runoffs will be moving next year to Heartland Park in Topeka Kansas. For the Solo crowd that means and extra mile of travel south from the current location of Forbes Field. The road racers will have a different trek as the event moves west from the current location at the Mid-Ohio Sports Car course. The road racers will also go there in October instead of the current September timeframe. Stay tuned for more information.

Speaking of Road Racers, Tom Tipsword had an April race at IRP and said it was an enjoyable weekend. In his words that means he didn't wreck. He said he was leading his class with his competitors right under his gearbox when he brushed a wall exiting a corner. It changed the toe enough to slow him and let his competitors get by. But he was quite happy with his results because "at his age" running well is a big accomplishment. His next race is coming up at Gingerman Raceway in June.

In the race for the Berry trophy Gene Young leads Terry Davis by three points. One point back in third is Ken Andrew while Bob Sonntag trails Ken by one point. Completing the top five is Paul Dornburg. 43 club members have at least one Berry point which means they have attended at least one event this year.

After three Rallys Gene Young has a slim three point lead over Terry Davis. Ken Andrew, Paul Dornburg and Bob Sonntag are tied for third. 17 club members have been to at least one rally this year.

Scott Miliam leads the field of six rookies based on his great result in the "Opening Bookend" autocross. John Esche and Kathryn Birdwell are second and third respectively.

The autocross points are headed by WRX driver Tim Brown. His great times in the street tire class made him the top SIR club point getter at the Opening Bookend. The race tire crowd was displaced by non-club members with Barry Beaman being the fastest of the SIR group. Remember, autocross trophy points are based on the sum of a drivers best time from each three run session. That total is then multiplied by a PAX number to get the indexed time. The fastest indexed time gets 1000 points while all slower drivers get a lesser percentage of points depending on how much slower they were than the fastest driver. And since separate points are awarded to each tire division, a slower driver in the street tire class can garner as many points as the fastest race tire class driver. That's what happened at Lawrenceville in the first event.

<u>Cars – Let the Good Times Roll</u> SIR Speed Freakz

Remember your dream car in that era of high school, or the list of them? And, remember the car you drove. Most of us could find a manual transmission on any car sales lot back then. Just try that today – it's challenging. How many SIR members drove competitively, legally, in high school? We all wish we had. We might also remember those who failed in unsafe conditions. Today's youngsters are not different in their desires to drive, to push a bit harder, maneuver, go faster and feel the rush. It is fantabulous that the SCCA and SIR has a forum to expend this energy in the safest possible way.

Putting the hammer down in all the right places with all the right safety gear are two of our young local talents, 17 year old **John Esche** and 16 year old **Kent Schonberger**. Both attend FJ Reitz High School in Evansville. They share a red '04 Birel chassis F125 kart and run against the clock in SOLO II with SIR. They quickly graduated from the old Coyote / Briggs and Stratton setup they utilized in the 2004 season.

The talk of cars and racing were common place early in Kent's life. Being the son of Barry Schonberger, of Team Tiger, Kent has been exposed to all facets racing. Barry competes in the SCCA's Road Racing GT2 class in his Sunbeam Tiger which followed many years of participation in SCCA SOLO II. In Kent's younger years he was an assistant in the paddock for his dad, checking tire pressures, cleaning body panels and doing other jobs. Once he was old enough to enter the hot pits, he became a full fledged pit crew member. Barry depends on his efforts to help make a race run smooth.

John's automotive competition experience did not begin in the SCCA but rather at the tractor pulls with his family. In Vanderburgh County he holds the title of 2004 Champion 12,000 Pound Farm Stock Tractor Pull. John hauled this load with an International Farmall Turbo. He can be seen at the fair defending his title at the Pulls again this year around July 24-26.

John's favorite auto sport to watch is NASCAR and he roots for #3, Dale Earnhardt Jr. Formula One is tops on Kent's list. Like so many, he watches the talented Michael Schumacher closely. Both fellows find the World Rally Cup intriguing. Whenever these buds have spare time they also get wheel experience on a 250 Yamaha dirt bike and a 150 Honda 4-wheeler. They also contributed a great deal of effort making the Lawrenceville course smoother by participating at the 2005 Patch Party.

Like scenery in the background of a track, high school years will fly by. As good drivers do, while entering the first gate on course, these young drivers are looking for the next turn. Kent would like to steer to a career in Automotive Design and is pointing towards the University of Columbia to obtain that degree. John would like to pursue a study at the University of Evansville majoring in studies as a Technical Engineer. "The sky's the limits!" says John.

Our freedom to play our game is a gift; it is a joy to pass it on to the next generation.

It really helped the events be more family oriented and usually a lot of kids were at the events also. It is a shame that we don't have that many women running now. There are a lot in other regions and quite a turnout for Nationals and they are not only running women's class but in the open class's as well.

<u>Rallys</u>

Ken Andrew's "Wander Warrick Rally" was held on May 1st and started at Castle High School in Newburgh. Ryan Bootz showed up with a new navigator, L Neidig, and took the first place trophy in the three car A class. They almost aced the first checkpoint with a one point penalty. Their second checkpoint penalty was just 22 which put them some 177 points ahead of the second place car of John Coen and Frank Totten. Third in A class was the Eagleson team. B class champs were Team Cannon followed by the Terry Davis / Josh Andrew combo while third was Gene Young and Julie Seeber. Gene still leads in the run for the Club Rally Trophy but only by three points over the second place three way tie of Terry Davis, Paul Dornburg and Bob Sonntag. The next rally will be the Heck Rally on October 2nd.

<u>Autocross</u>

May is always the month for our Opening Bookend event at the Lawrenceville sight. 43 drivers made the long trek to Lawrence county Illinois for a cool but sunny afternoon of time trials. For once the number of members far exceeded the number of guests. In the past over half the field has been made of Guests. This day only 11 Guests were present. As Bob mentioned in his article there were familiar cars and faces but a new mix of the two.

In the points battle the street tired guys put it on the race tired guys. We index the results based on the sum of the fastest run in each of the two sessions and the first six guys in points are street tired machines. Tim Brown holds the top spot driving his potent Subaru WRX Sti while Barry Beaman was the fastest of the race tired cars. If Tim makes all the events he has a shot at the Club Autocross Trophy. Last year Glenn Deno was the points leader through the first three events but failed to compete in any more events. At the pace he was going he could have been the champ. It looks like Tim will be hard to beat if he attends all the events.

Our youngest competitors, John Esche and Kent Schonberg had their new F125 shifter kart at the event. It looks like they are going to need some practice with that thing because they had trouble getting it going and keeping it going. Barry, Kent's dad, was a busy mechanic in each session handling the coaching and the wrenches. Our next event is at Heritage Hills High School near Santa Claus Indiana. We have Phil Wells to thank for helping us secure this site and although the lot is not the biggest we use we always have a fun time and sometimes new adventures. Let's hope that this years event is not quite as adventuresome as last years.
