July Report

Happy Birthday USA!! Though we're in the midst of the summer autocross season this month seems a bit, well, relaxed. It's just the Peru Tour over the Fourth and this year's second visit to the Centre in Evansville.

Though the Solo II Nationals are months away it's time to be planning your trip. The club has reserved six rooms in Topeka at a great price. If you are interested in using one of the rooms be sure to let me know. Otherwise the club's travel agent (not me) may release the room you thought you had.

The Heritage Hills Autocross course got rave reviews from the experienced autocrossers. We cranked out six runs for all fifty entrants in a very reasonable amount time. The highlight of the day had to be the turnout. We had nineteen guests! That's an incredible 38% of the entrants!! Julie Seeber was so taken with the day's action that she has donated a new printer to the club. Thanks Julie. The downside to the day had to be the way we got going -- a few minutes late and with far too many DNF runs. In hopes better experiences with future events I'm spending this month's REport touching some non-car aspects of getting autocross ready. We can't always overwork Paul Dornburg in Registration and then have him adding pylons and adding pylons and adding pylons and being one himself!

I will start with event registration. Think "be early." Register for our events through www.MyAutoEvents.com. Our events can be found by searching for "SIR/SCCA." MyAutoEvents registration gets you into our computer system early. To help encourage this early registration we knock \$2 off the entry fee for those that pre-register. If you're not web-enabled, give Paul Dornburg or another Board member a call. There isn't any money involved so even if you're "iffy" registering on-line is the thing to do. It's much easier and quicker to remove entries than to add them. The on-site portion of "be early" is to complete Tech and return your card to Registration. We only need to process something like one entrant every 90 seconds on average. That's done pretty easily except when we start doing the last 10 entrants at 12:29. "Be early" doesn't just apply to driving the course.

We start course set-up at 9:30 A.M. Other than event marshal and safety steward duties there are few specifically assigned tasks. Some of the set-up regulars do the same things at every event. That's just habit, not some kind of requirement. Just jump on in. The next three paragraphs describe getting the site ready. We like to have the site ready by 11:00. The subsequent paragraphs touch on eliminating DNFs which helps make for better times (pun intended).

Following some preliminary unloading of the trailer we secure the site and relocate any vehicles parked in troublesome spots. We then follow the event marshal's plan for the course, grid, and paddock areas. The general routine is to take an initial pass chucking pylons from the trailer as the trailer is pulled around the course. We then spend a

good bit of time setting the pylons properly. Once the pylons are placed, the course gets a safety check. There is usually then a semi-speed test run to look for holes or things that seem confusing from the car but didn't when the course was being set up. After any tweaking, the course is ready to be marked. In our case, that's just the outlining of the pylons. Because of the mess, potential environment concerns, expense, and the trouble we do not line the course as is done at some other events.

We also like to get somebody started on the blower as soon as we have an idea of what needs to be blown. The blowing can start as soon as 9:30 if we have somebody ready to go. We use the blower to clean the course areas before we run it. This gives those running first a clean course and maximizes the grip for all of us. It's really important that we rotate people through the blower. So if you notice the same person on the blower for more than 30 minutes, please take a turn.

The last big tasks are setting the trailer and getting Tech, Registration, & Timing/Scoring ready to go. We're usually doing this while the course is being cleaned, marked, and walked. We are setting up the corner stations at this time too. Basically, we are trying to have as many of these course set-up tasks going on concurrently as we can manage. Our set-up master plan is based on an assumption that enough people know enough of the steps that the whole thing becomes a self-directed project.

As an entrant you should be thinking about waking the course effectively. Though walking can be great exercise, the point of the course walking is to learn the course. Do you know where the course goes? If not ask. Consider walking the course until you could draw it easily from memory. You're going to have to be able to recall the course at anywhere from 5 to 25 times your walking speed! Do you know it that well? Without hesitation? While walking the course it's quite easy to watch the ground just in front of your feet, the cute rump in front of you, or to look over to whom your walking and chatting. Well, you SHOULD be looking where you'll be looking while running the course. Or in two words, "LOOK AHEAD!" Focus on learning the course. Practice your looking ahead skills while walking the course. Your course walks will be as effective as you make them. If you need to walk alone, do so. If you need to hang back from a group to see farther ahead do so. If you're a real hot chick with a great buttocks I hope you're still walking about 10 feet in front of me cause I don't mind the extra walk or three. Oops. I think I've typed these lines instead of just thinking them to myself. Blast. Another advantage of looking ahead on your course walks is that you can generally minimize your waiting time at Tech and/or Registration by taking another walk or by heading over to either Tech or Registration. If there's a line, walk again. No line, well then there you go. Unless it's like 12:15, then you need to complete Tech & Registration completed directly.

We plan to continue the guided course walks for novice entrants. They'll generally start about 12:15. The guided course walk should not be the novice's sole or first course walk. It's an opportunity for a bit of instruction. If you're new to autocrossing and would like to have guidance on an earlier course walk please check with the registration crew. They'll be able to arrange it. We also give novices a parade lap prior to the start of their first runs.

The basic run order is that half the entrants make three runs while the other half work the course. We then swap drivers for workers. We'll do that twice and by the end of the day everybody has had the opportunity for six runs. We split those sharing a car across the heats.

We really like having lots of short (one or two cars) grid lanes. This allows the cars in grid to be stationary between runs. At Heritage Hills, except for the mod and prepared cars, the grid was in near constant motion. We also like to have those using the club's loaner helmets at the front of the grid. This enables us to run loaner helmet drivers first, then while the loaner helmets are being shuffled to their next driver, we keep the event flowing by running cars whose drivers have their own helmets. We're going to start setting up "helmet buddies" at the drivers meeting.

Tech and Registration close at 12:30. The registration crew then works feverishly to prepare and check the run order. Any registration delays ripple into the drivers meeting so that's yet another reason to get through Tech and Registration early. The goal is start the drivers meeting at 12:45, quickly cover the drivers meeting material, and then get course workers going to their stations in time to be ready to start the parade lap at 1:00. The thirty minutes from 12:30 to 1:00 go all too quickly!

Time permitting, we entertain the idea of \$1 fun runs. Fun runs are available to registered drivers in tech'd cars. If you're not interested in taking fun runs, we'd like you to work the course. Otherwise, those that want fun runs have to both run and work the course. By extension, please remember that we will not do fun runs without course workers. So if you run lots of fun runs you may be keeping someone else from being able take a fun run. Perhaps the next time we do fun runs, you'll take your turn working the course first.

I've touched on a lot of material in this article. It's pretty simple stuff. The magic is that so many of these tasks just get done by somebody. We are basically working as high-performing team as we seem to know what the others are doing. Now everybody has the information needed to become a part of the team. Only the experience is missing. Come work on that at our July autocross.

I hope to see you at the Lone Star on Tuesday and again at the Centre on the 25th.

Autocross

The first June autocross was held at Heritage Hills High School on the first hot day of the summer. We had 50 drivers show up to take on a Terry Davis designed course. Longtime SIR SCCA club member Davis has a hand in most course designs but this one was all his. He laid out a very nice, flowing course on the very small school parking lot. After last years near disaster, when a car ran off the end of the course, grazed two cars and broke off a fire hydrant, the course design emphasis was on having the end of the course point away from entrants and spectators.

The course design paid off as not one near-miss was observed but DNF's (off courses) were plentiful. A popular theory to all the DNF's was that we run Lawrenceville too much. That airport course is always the same because the bad concrete will only allow us to run one course. And since we've used this course layout for the better part of seven years most of us know it by heart. And that's ok as long as we're there. What happens when we layout a different course? People get lost. There were three people that went off course on every run! The thought occurred to me to put people out there to point the way but I doubt that we have any souls that are that brave or fleet of foot and can you imagine what the SCCA insurance guy might say? "You used what for course markers?"

Showing the way with Fast Time was Louisville's Mike Spence followed by Bob Sonntag and Phil Wells. Paul Dornburg and Andy Grayson were fourth and fifth respectively. Rounding out the top 10 were Ted Eagleson, Derek Funk, Frank Bertke, Terry Davis and Jay Bonvouloir. Trophies will be handed out at the July Club meeting July 12th

The competition for the Club Autocross trophy is in a three way tie for first between Tim Brown, Don Kelley and Paul Dornburg. Tim got his 1000 points at the Opening Lawrenceville event while Don and Paul each got 1000 at Heritage Hills. Look for this competition to get even closer as the drivers get their rides sorted out.

By the time you get this publication the results for the first Owensboro event should be posted. The next event will be July 24th event at the Civic Center in Evansville. Pre-register at MyAutoEvents.com and save two bucks.
