September REport

I was just reading the presidents article in SportsCar about the recent event at Heartland Park. They held a road race and an autocross event the same weekend and everyone was all smiles about how well things went. It's a logical combination of events, road racing and autocrossing. But what about autocrossing, drag races and a car show? That's an unlikely combination especially considering the amount of room needed for all the events and the diverse crew needed to run each event.

Bowler Transmissions of Lawrenceville IL had their 3rd Annual Day at the Strip Car show, autocross and drag races. Our part was to put on the autocross while Bowler organized the car show and the drag races. The event was a throwback to the days, over half-century ago, when George Field AFB (now Mid-American Air Center) was the site of the first-ever "World Series of Drag Racing" This event was so big, it was covered not only in "Hot Rod" and "Rod and Custom", but in "Life" and "Time" magazines as well! Racers came from both coasts and from all over the Midwest to race. The turnout for 2006 was very good for all the events. I know I heard a nitro engine in one of the drag strip cars. A number of our competitors took a few moments to take a run on the strip. Kyle Bledsoe hit 110 in the quarter in his Subaru WRX Sti. I even saw Bob Sonntag in the LeGrand BMod make a run. And what really made the day was the gorgeous weather. After a week of extremely hot and humid weather that Saturday was warm, breezy and quite pleasant. We're already thinking about next year's event which should be bigger and better.

In early August our mid-year autocross event at Lawrenceville had the lowest attendance I can remember of any recent events. Only 19 drivers took part in the event on a blistering Sunday afternoon. We were done by 3:00 PM and on the road home by 4:00 PM. I hope our next event at Owensboro is better attended.

Tom Bootz showed up at the event droving his "old" car and showed that he has not lost the touch for these "parking lot" races. As a matter of fact after looking at his times he may be even better than he was before. Road racing certainly hasn't hurt his autocross skills.

There's a good battle shaping up for the autocross trophy. Jim Cannon leads me by 12 points after 5 events. 51 points adrift in third is Bob Sonntag followed closely, 10 points behind, by Ryan Bootz. Rounding out the top 5 is Tim Brown 15 points in arrears of Ryan. With at least 2 events to go this award will be probably be determined at the last event.

The Autocross event for September was listed as a Test and tune but I think it'll be a regular autocross. If the Board decides that, it'll give some of you that have missed an event earlier this year a chance to make up points. We'd still only count 6 events but you'll be able to throw out your 2 worst events instead of one. The Board meets early in September and will make a decision then.

Speaking of the Board it'll be time to elect/re-elect officers for 2007. Please be thinking about who you'd like to have preserving, paddling and steering this ship. We'll be talking about that too at our September board meeting.

We've got 8 Rookies (new members) in the last 12 months but only 2 are vying for the rookie title. Eric Provost and Dr. Jane Bridges are the 2 in the running for the trophy. Tucker Harvey, Dan Hendricks, Sean Lips, Josh Nay, Jackson Staley and Jeffery Walin have yet to participate in an event.

October brings our last Autocross event and the remainder of the Rally season. It would be nice if we could see more faces at these Rallys and I'm hoping that Gene Young and Tim Green come up with a Sunday double, maybe along the lines of Gene's map event.

It looks like about 4 drivers will make the trek to Topeka to try out the new asphalt at Heartland Park. I wish we had more but it's a weeklong commitment and not everyone wants to spend their vacation days that way. And who knows what kind of weather one will be faced with. Last year we saw every type of weather except snow and with the event being moved later in the month that may be a remote possibility.

At the Solo Nationals the Thursday night entertainment has changed for 2006. Instead of a talent contest there's a video contest. I've already started thinking about what I can put together. I'm sure Gene, Bob, Ryan and anyone else that takes videos will contribute footage. Here's the hot poop.

Solo Nationals -- Are you ready?


It's that time of year when a small group of us make the trek to Kansas to compete in the Solo Nationals. It's a week filled with four days of the best autocross action one can experience. Being apart of what is perhaps the largest motorsport event in the world is a interesting all by itself. The Indy 500 has like 400,000 spectators. NASCAR races have huge crowds and an incredible marketing presence. F1 races have serious world-wide following and are run on several continents. But events in those series don't have 50 entrants. Heck, it's not uncommon for the Solo Nationals to have 50 entrants in a single class! Or to have the total entrant count well over 1000.

If you are entering and have not already done so, do it right now. There are two tiers to this year's late entry fees. The first \$75 is effective September fourth and second (another \$75) hits on the eighth.

Besides this year's shift from Forbe's Field to Heartland Park the SIR/SCCA housing operation is a bit different. Travel agent Jan is on hiatus (though she's probably thinking "retired"). A small block of rooms is being held at the Fairfield Inn that we have used in the past (1530 SW Westport Drive). The phone number is 785-273-6800. Call and ask for one of the "Southern Indiana SCCA" rooms. The rate is \$70 per night with up to four people in the room. They have six rooms (more can be made available) and we can arrive as early as Friday, September 22.

Drivers hone skills on course



Autocross held at Owensboro airport

Despite a strong showing recently on a road course in Atlanta, Glenn Wior of Evansville nipped a few cones and got a little off course in his 1970 Jaguar E-series Sunday during an autocross at the Owensboro airport.

"The car did fine, but the driver did lousy," Wior said about his first three runs through the three-quarter-mile course on the airport's tarmac. "I think I have an aversion to cones."

Wior was one of 40 drivers who navigated the twisting, turning track for the second of two annual autocrosses held by the Southern Indiana Region Sports Car Club of America at the Owensboro-Daviess County Regional Airport.

Cars, carts and a truck zipped through the track in times ranging from under 40 seconds to over a minute, with penalties assessed for missing a turn or knocking over a cone.

The vehicles ranged from open-wheel models designed by engineering students to stock cars, including a Geo Metro, and classic racers like Wior's Jaguar or a 1968 Datsun Roadster.

"I beat the Kia," said Glenn Wior after finishing his three runs through an autocross course set up on part of the runway at Owensboro-Daviess County Regional Airport. Wior, 56, of Evansville, drove a restored 1970 Jaguar XKE that he bought in 1970. Wior was among 40 cars and their drivers entered in the Southern Indiana Region Sports Car Club of America event.

"You can compete in anything," said Gary Heck of Newburgh, Ind., the club's treasurer and the announcer Sunday. "That's the beauty of this."

Each driver had six runs on the course, which stretched in front of the airport's terminal, and the driver's best time in each of the three-run heats was combined for a final score.

Vehicles are grouped in a number of different classes based on type, modifications and weight, and there is also an indexing system so different vehicles can compare times, Heck said.

Jim Cannon of Petersburg, Ind., was running his 1991 Eagle Talon, which doubles as his daily driver and has little modification, while friend Darrin Bailey's 1989 Honda CRX has been modified extensively, including new tires, rims, engine and suspension.

Novice drivers are paired with a driving instructor to help ensure their safety as they make their way through the course's tight turns at speeds up to 45

There have been few accidents apart from spinouts, in part because of the large open areas around the course that allow for mistakes, said Bailey, a Princeton resident.

"We don't want anyone to get hurt," Cannon said.

With each run, drivers typically become a little more daring, a little more fearless and, typically, a little faster.

By the last several runs, drivers can be looking to just shave portions of a second off of their times as they find better lines around the course, which varies from autocross to autocross, Heck said.

Bailey said if he had children, he could require them to participate in autocross so they could become more familiar with how vehicles handle and to improve reaction times.

"It's a way to get out and improve your driving skills," Bailey said. "You've just got to come out and do it."
