September 2014 REport

Greetings everyone and welcome to the September 2014 edition of the <u>Pit Stop!</u> Recently, there was a lot of talk on our mailing list related to our autocross schedule at the Mid-American Air Center. A common theme throughout those discussions was an interest in starting our first runs earlier than the standard 1:00 pm start time. At the last Board meeting we discussed the MAAC schedule and the feasibility of getting the first runs started earlier than 1:00 pm. What follows is a summary of that discussion.

(Note: This information was originally posted on our mailing list prior to our last autocross and posted here for those who didn't catch it on our mailing list.)

Should course setup start earlier than 9:30?

• The Board decided NOT to start earlier than our usual 9:30 a.m. start time.

• How can we streamline the registration process?

- Members should have their membership card, driver's license, tech card, and payment in hand as they approach the trailer to register.
 - Checks should be pre-written and, if paying by cash, exact change isn't required, but really helps.
- Weekend members should also have their license, tech card, and payment ready (cash only for non-members). In addition, their weekend membership forms should already be filled out before they get in line.
 - If you bring a weekend member, please be proactive in getting them a form when you arrive.
 - ■We will have weekend forms available with the tech crew to help get those forms distributed.

• Can we improve the tech process?

- o The Board decided not to change the tech process at this time.
- However, it is helpful to get your car ready for tech once you arrive, especially if the car hasn't been through tech before.
 - Clear out the loose items.
 - ■Open the hood and trunk.
 - Get your helmet out and place it in the car.
 - If you are a regular, go ahead and get the number on your car.
- o If you are a regular attendee and already have a card, you won't need to stay with your car (grab a blower and get to work!).
- Weekend members should stay with their car until it has been through tech so that the tech crew does not have to spend time trying to locate the car's owner.

• How can we improve the course setup process?

- The Board determined that the slowest phase of course setup is process of getting the course cleaned off with the blowers.
 - There are three blowers available 2 walk behind blowers and a backpack blower. We want all three in use on the course as soon as possible no later than 9:45!.
 - \blacksquare To help with that effort, we will be providing a map of the areas that need to be blown.
 - The pylons do not need to be in place prior to the start of the blowing process.
 - We would like members to volunteer to run the blowers in 15 to 20 minute shifts.
 - Please be proactive in this process. If you find yourself in the paddock with some down time, head out on the course and ask those with the blowers if they are done with their shift. Offer to take the next shift.

• Will we start running any earlier?

- o It depends, but, if we get the course setup process moving more quickly, there's a good chance we can.
- Please note that we'll have to announce an earlier start time at least 30 minutes in advance of the new start time so that everyone has a chance to hit the terminal and make final preparations.

We are going to implement the items mentioned above at our upcoming autocross events and make every effort to get things started as soon as possible. If it's important to you to get started early, you can help make that happen by getting involved in the setup process. If you don't know what needs to be done, come find either Bob or me and we'll get you pointed in the right direction.

I want to make a couple of other points related to that perceived downtime that typically happens around 11:30 or so. During that time, there is still a lot of registration work going on in the trailer and we often have some final course inspection in progress. Those activities are typically being carried out by members who have been busy since they arrived at 9:30. Those folks deserve a few minutes at the end of the setup process to relax, get some food and water, walk the course, and prep their cars.

Personally, if I can squeeze 15 to 30 minutes of downtime prior to the first run, I'm happy to have it. I enjoy spending time in the paddock area hanging out with all the other car enthusiasts talking smack about the event. If you find yourself sitting in the paddock getting annoyed that we haven't started running, get up and go find out if there's something you can do to speed things up. If there's not anything to do, just sit back, relax and remember that you are surrounded by great cars and great people. Enjoy it!

Recent Events

August started with Paul and Carolyn Dornburg's annual Ice Cream Rally (Rally #4 of 7) on Sunday, August 3rd. We had eight teams two in Class A, four in Class B, and two in the Guest Class. The overall low score of 106 was posted by Ernie Roales and Ben Davis in Class B. Team Beasley took the Class A win over Team Davis/Sonntag with a score of 190. Top spot in the Guest Class went to Bill and Dawn Caudill with a very respectable 544.

On Sunday, August 17th we were back at the Mid-American Air Center for our fifth autocross of the season. First time Event Marshall, John Memmer, designed a great course for the event. Unfortunately, after we completed the course set up, a steady rain began to fall causing timing issues and leaving up to four inches of standing water on the course in some areas. After only a few runs, we decided to postpone the event. See the Upcoming Events section for information about the makeup date for the event.

On Sunday, August 24th, we held our fifth rally of the season. Jim Cannon was the Rally Master for the event. There were six teams at the rally - two in Class A, three in Class B, and a team in the Guess Class. For the second event in a row, Class B won the day with a low score of 70 posted by Sue and Jay Wolf. Team Davis/Sonntag won Class A with a score of 199. Seems all those computers and calculators used by Class A aren't providing any advantage against the Class B teams.

Upcoming Events

The board meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 2nd at the Townsquare Media offices in downtown Evansville. We'll be starting around 6:30, and, as always, visitors are welcome.

On Sunday, September 7th, the Southern Illinois Region will hold their 2nd and final autocross of the season at the Mid-American Air Center. I have not seen an official schedule for the event but, if they stick to their usual schedule, setup will start at 9:00 am and the first run will start at 12:00 pm. There will be a BBQ immediately following the event. If you are planning to participate in the event and stay for the BBQ, please send your RSVP to Craig Straub (craigstraub@sbcglobal.net) on or before September 3rd.

On Tuesday September 9th, we'll return to Smitty's for our September member meeting. We'll gather at 6:30 for dinner, and the meeting will start around 7:30. The program for September's meeting has not yet been determined, but, as soon as we get a program scheduled, we'll post the information on the website and on the mailing list.

After a week off, we are planning a double autocross weekend on Saturday, September 20th and Sunday September 21st. We are adding the Saturday event as a makeup event for the August autocross that was postponed due to weather. John Memmer will be the Event Marshall on Saturday and will likely use the same course we tried to run at the August event. Paul Dornburg will be the Event Marshall for Sunday's portion of the event. Currently, the plan is to follow our normal schedule on both days. The final details on the schedule will be determined at the next board meeting and announced on our site (www.sirscca.org) and at the September member meeting.

Finally, I'd like to mention that we are planning to have our October member meeting at Roca Bar North (12301 Hwy. 41 North,

Evansville, IN 47725) on October 14th. Prior to that meeting I'll be sending out a request for RSVP's since, like our Log Inn meeting, I'll need to provide the venue with a participant count. That's it for now. See you all soon!

Sports Car Club of America - Southern Indiana Division - Board of Directors Minutes - August 5, 2014

Attendees:

Matt Beasley, Regional Executive; Paul Blaylock, Activities Chairman; Lora Blaylock, Secretary; Bob Sonntag, Advisor to the Board; Barry Schonberger, Assistant Regional Executive; Ben Davis, *Pit Stop*/Website; Terry Davis, Paul Dornburg, John Memmer, members.

Officer Reports:

The minutes were accepted on motion and second.

Bob presented a balance sheet for the club. He continues to whittle away at the outstanding SCCA invoices, \$125 of which may be in error.

Barry reported that George and Doris Beckerman are slated to provide the program (national pro rally history) at this month's membership meeting in addition to his and Terry's history lesson.

We have seven new members this year, including two in the KY chapter. Kevin Smalley will be moving out of the area due to work; a new membership chair will be needed.

Old Business:

The patch items have been delivered to the trailer, which has been photo-inventoried. Paul B will make a list from the pictures. Thanks to Barry for his help and space!

Paul B will fix errors in the online calendar. Paul D straightened out the time zone issues in the Yahoo group calendar. Ben will make sure the website reflects the correct information.

New Business:

Bob shared information on the Schweitzer Fest Car Show, happening this weekend. Ben will post the information to the website.

Matt will turn in the reservation number to the Log Inn this Saturday for the membership meeting. He will ask for the last space in the room or to have empty spaces on either side to help with hearing, as it is often loud in the party room.

Matt reports that he will be out of town for the September membership meeting; Barry will take the helm in his absence. The October membership meeting will be either at the Roca Bar North or the Old Hickory in Owensboro.

Paul B will correct an error on the website - rally points and Berry points are reporting incorrectly due to a merge problem.

The timing equipment at autocrosses has been working smoothly, even with the old reflector. There was a problem with the start lights; it may be time to replace them. The vinyl numbers made by Matt worked well for the August 3 rally. Matt is looking for a static cling material that would be re-usable.

A substantial discussion was held on the comment that we could begin autocross runs earlier in the day. Bob shared a very helpful two-page breakdown of all the tasks - in order - required to set up and be ready to run. Lora wondered if it could be augmented with pictures/diagrams that would allow those unfamiliar with the process to jump in more autonomously. After the lengthy discussion, it was felt that there is not very much time that could eliminated from the set-up portion of the day, particularly if the course is complicated and/or long. However, the following will be implemented:

- Get all 3 blowers going as early in the day as possible, as this is one of the most time consuming (and physically taxing) tasks.
- Close registration in a timely fashion.
- Make sure that tech has weekend membership forms available, and assign someone to be responsible for weekend memberships.
- Encourage those who are finished prepping and tech-ing their cars to help finish setting up.
- When possible, start may be moved up as conditions (course and technology being ready and tech/registration complete) allow.

The idea of having cars come to tech/registration may be re-visited in the future.

As there was no further business, the meeting adjourned.

John Memmer's autocross this weekend (August 17) is promised to be a technical event, not the horsepower fest one might anticipate. All are encouraged to attend. The second Southern Illinois autocross of the season is scheduled for September 7 - please be sure to RSVP if you plan to attend, as they'll have food after the driving is finished.

Scheduled guest speakers George and Doris Beckerman were unable to attend the meeting due to illness, so Terry Davis and Barry Shonberger presented an extended history report, featuring fashion! 
