#### January 2015 REport

Happy New Year fellow SIR.SCCA members! Is everyone ready for 2015?

Wow, where did 2014 go? Seems like just yesterday I was out at the MAAC cutting concrete and trying, unsuccessfully, to operate a jack hammer. I'd like to start my report with a big thank you to all the members who made last year a success. I appreciate all the members who show up every weekend to help make our events run smoothly. I would also like to thank everyone for allowing me, in only my 2nd year as a member, to be a part of the leadership team for this great club. I couldn't have done it without the support of our members and the veterans on our club's Board. I leaned on those veteran board members a lot as I learned how to be a Regional Executive in the SCCA. I'm looking forward to returning in that role in 2015. Guess I won't be able to use the "rookie" excuse anymore, though.

Well, enough about me, let's look back at some highlights from 2014.

The start of our season was dominated by winter weather. Our first two rallies, scheduled in March, had to be postponed. The weather didn't diminish the turnout for our Solo Safety Steward class, though. Several members attended the class including some folks from our Western Kentucky chapter. Thanks, Paul Dornburg, for organizing and running the class. As a result of that class, we've added one new Solo Safety Steward to our club's roster. Thanks, Jay Wolf, for taking on that extra responsibility!

The 2014 Mid-American Air Center patching efforts were very successful. We patched a record number of holes this year even though our first fill day was canceled due, once again, to the weather. We installed over 11 cubic yards of new concrete, beating our previous high by about 3 cubic yards. This year we used pneumatic instead of electric jack hammers and rented a larger concrete saw. Also this year we started the cutting on Saturday instead of Sunday and that really helped to keep things moving.

Our 2014 autocross season saw the return of many familiar faces at the top of the time sheets. Those familiar faces never saw first place, though, when rookie, John Memmer, entered an event. John took the top spot in the first 6 events scoring a perfect 6000 points for the season. John took the 2014 autocross and rookie trophies. Congratulations, John!

The rally program continued in 2014 with another strong year. The events were well attended, averaging 6 cars per event, and we had several guest and first time members show up to try rallying. The unequipped Class B teams continued to prove that rally computers and GPS units aren't necessary as they outscored the equipped Class A teams in four of the seven events. At the end of the season, four members tied for the top spot in points.

Congratulations to our 2014 Rally Champions - Bob Sonntag, Terry Davis, Jim Cannon, and Darlene Cannon!

The Berry Points trophy was, once again, won by Bob Sonntag. Bob has now held that trophy since 2004 even though he continually tells everyone exactly how to win it (hint...participate!). This year he had close competition from Jim Cannon who only missed the top spot by four points. Maybe next year, Jim. Congratulations on your Berry Point win, Bob!

#### 2015 Calendar Highlights

Our first driving event of the season takes place in March with Rally #1. We are also considering a rally school in March. April will be dedicated to our annual patch party. Plan to set aside the weekends of April 12th and April 19th to help our club improve our autocross site. Here's your chance to earn those extra autocross runs! In May we have our 2nd rally and our first autocross of the season. June and July will each have a rally and an autocross. In August we'll have another rally and two autocrosses. September has one autocross and the Solo Nationals in Nebraska. In October we have our last points autocross of the season and another Rally. In November we have our last rally of the season and a possible fun autocross at Roberts Park. We'll be posting the full calendar on the club's website soon.

#### 2015 Goals

My primary goal for 2015 is, once again, to increase the participation in our rally program. I know I sound like a broken record, but I really hope some of you try a rally for the first time this year. My favorite memories during my brief time with the club all come from the rallies. I promise that you will enjoy the event if you come out and try one (don't make me beg).

Another goal for 2015 is to improve our autocross management. We will continue to streamline the registration process and want to get more members involved in the trailer duties (registration, timing, etc...). We only have a couple of members who can run timing and we would like to get a few more members involved in that task. We also want to improve the course setup workflow - getting the blowers engaged as soon as possible and making sure the pylon marking takes place AFTER the course has been cleaned with the blowers.

Another area of focus in 2015 will be on our event notification process. We want to establish a more formal procedure for those notifications. The weather played a huge role in our events this year and we hope to develop a better process for notifying the club when events are delayed or cancelled.

#### **Past Events**

On Sunday, November 9th, we had our final rally of the season. Terry Davis was the Rally Master for this event and Bob Sonntag assisted. Terry and Bob put together a great new Evansville route that started at the Hardee's on North 41 and finished at the Los Bravos on First Avenue. We had seven cars in the rally - two in Class A, four in Class B, and one in the Guest Class. Ben Davis and I won Class A, but it was sort of by default. Our other Class A competition got lost and didn't hit all the checkpoints. Ben and I got lost too, but were lucky enough to accidentally end up back on the right road going in the right direction. We didn't even know we had gone off course until we got the results. Team Cannon took Class B and also beat the Class A winners to take best time of the day...by quite a bit. Ben and I finished the day with a score of 856. Team Cannon had a score of 247. That score included an elusive 0 at checkpoint 4. Congratulations, Team Cannon! Scoring a 0 at a checkpoint in the unequipped class is quite an accomplishment. You will find the complete results of this event later in this edition.

Our non-points autocross event at Roberts Park on Sunday, November 16th was cancelled due to a scheduling conflict with the Parks Department. There was a weekend long soccer tournament taking place in Evansville and they were using our site for parking. I would like to apologize for that mix up. In the future, we'll make sure that we have exclusive use of that parking lot when we schedule events.

On Sunday, November 30th, we finally managed to host an autocross event at Roberts Park. Much like last year's post-Thanksgiving event, we got a break in the weather. We had 20 members and 16 weekend members competing at the event. Several regular members were unable to attend so we were shorthanded at the "skill" positions - justification that we need more members trained to cover the various autocross duties. Thanks to those members who jumped in to fill in where needed. The top spot was won by Kenny Dilger. Congratulations, Kenny! Look out in 2015, I think Kenny has that Cayman figured out.

Note: We were unable to secure the required rental cars and, therefore, cancelled the City Autocross Challenge.

On Friday, December 5th, we hosted our 2014 Awards Banquet at Rolling Hills Country Club in Newburgh. After some great food (thankfully, no peppermint cheesecake was served), we handed out 2014 trophies.

Matt called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to the meeting.

#### Officer Reports

The minutes were accepted as sent.

Treasurer Bob reported that the club is operating in the black and that he is working with the Western Kentucky Chapter and the national office to clear open invoices. Current balances should carry the club

through next spring's patch parties, despite few revenue opportunities between now and then.

Activities Chair Paul B reports that he has corrected a small mistake involving one member's autocross points, and that he is tracking some new folks on the points spreadsheet.

#### **Old Business**

Paul D is serving as the club's contact person for the Midwest Musclecar Challenge, scheduled for May 2-3, 2015. It is expected that the event will take place in Terre Haute again this year and that the club will be asked to supply equipment and manpower.

Paul D also reports that SCCA may be able to separate the Western Kentucky Chapter's activities from SIR activities, thus eliminating the need for the chapter to become a region of its own.

#### New Business

Don Kelley's first rally on October 19 was super! Hopefully, the success will encourage him to design future rallies.

Paul B led a thorough discussion of the 2015 event calendar. Tentative dates for Mid American Air Center site evaluation and repair/improvement were selected in addition to the Autocross and Rally calendars (including rain dates) as well as the 2015 Awards Banquet. Bob will share our MAAC dates with the Southern Illinois Division to avoid any double-booking of the site.

Price and menu, including dessert, have been settled for next month's awards banquet. Bob will talk to Mary Harl about providing the game and prizes for the end of the banquet. Paul B and Matt will coordinate getting information to Tri-State Trophies by late next week.

The Roberts Park 'fun' Autocrosses are soon upon us, and with them, the "City Challenge." Thanks to Paul D for coordinating the details of this new contest, including the special numbering system. As for the cars needed, Bob will obtain the front wheel drive car, and John Memmer will obtain the rear wheel drive car. 9 of 12 invitees have responded so far. A reminder will be shared about noise concerns. "If others think your car is loud, don't bring it to Roberts Park."

Paul D demonstrated the online weekend member signup form. The app works on cell phone, computer, and tablet platforms, and is simple to use. Ben has agreed to be the 'weekend member registrar' for the Roberts Park events to keep things flowing smoothly.

Ben reported that the calendar add-on for the website (not the Google plug-in) has been causing problems, and he has temporarily disabled it while searching for a fix. Also, a recent change by the site hosting the *Pit Stop* pages has rendered them largely useless. Ben will change these to a PDF format.

Ballots for the 2015 Board were included in the November *Pit Stop*, and Bob will check the PO

Box for any mailed copies on his way to next week's membership meeting. Lora will have paper ballots ready for use at the meeting. Paul D will provide the program this month, reviewing the recent SCCA Autocross event at the National Corvette Museum.

The Board spent time discussing the Indian Award before adjourning.
