We supported a successful TMMI Autocross event, had a large group attend the 2016 Solo Nationals, and enjoyed many other competitive, but safe events. We also decided to start and support a new committee that will focus on advancing the interests of SIR ladies. MacKenzi Crowe was asked by the BOD to lead this committee and she agreed to take this job on. We've been impressed with her enthusiasm and ideas. You'll be hearing more from her soon.

Truly, we haven't focused on the interests of our SIR ladies or on those of potential new SIR female members like we could have or should have. It should not be a big surprise that women see our competition and our talk of competition differently than men do, but it was a little surprising for me. If you've read any of my articles, you know that I love Autocross. I love the action. I love running at the edge of my traction (and skill) limits. Board of Directors Meeting

October 4, 2015

Present: Dave Lehrschall, Regional Executive; Richard Grav, Assistant Regional Executive; Paul Blaylock, Activities Chair; Jr Crowe, Assistant Activities Chair; Bob Sonntag, Treasurer; Lora Blaylock, Secretary; Paul Dornburg, *Pit Stop*; MacKenzi Crowe, Terry Davis, Stacy Grav, guests

Regional Executive Dave Lehrschall welcomed everyone and called for officer reports. Secretary Lora Blaylock reported that a correction has been made to the September Membership minutes: MacKenzi Crowe came in 8th in her class at nationals, not 10th as originally typed. Treasurer Bob Sonntag reported that the club is in a good financial position, earning a nice sum from the TMMI event. Activities Chair Paul Blaylock reported that he is working with the trophy shop for some minor changes to the trophy glasses, and should have a new supply in soon. In addition, board plaques and traveling trophies should begin to make their way back to him for updating before the December awards banquet. Assistant Activities Chair Jr Crowe thanked Paul Dornburg for getting the ad for Larry's Automotive in *Pit Stop*, and wondered if it was available on our website yet. Assistant Regional Executive Richard Grav will consider making that happen. Paul Dornburg reported that he will get the correction to the minutes in the upcoming *Pit Stop*, in addition to other club members' finishes at Lincoln. Richard reported that he is glad to be here with his lovely wife. Dave thanked the board for all its work this year - he has had a great time with the club and looks forward to even better times in the future.

The board reviewed the TMMI event. Dave worked with TMMI employee Scott Milam to get feedback from the participants, which was nearly all positive. Folks liked the course over last year's, although some felt Lawrenceville was too far away (some said the same thing about the course at TMMI!) Especially appreciated was the ability to get 8 runs on track - we only promised 6. One request was for more educational/feedback ride-alongs. Also, some participants missed some of the TMMI communication, which was only in certain places in the plant; perhaps we need to ask for more in-house publicity next time.

Bob Sonntag has recorded a summary of details from the event, including the TMMI feedback, monetary info, schedule, trophies, and miscellaneous notes. The club made just under \$1,000, which is significantly more than last year. We may want to look at offering the event earlier in the year, in the hopes of converting TMMI guests to SIR members. In addition, we need to be clear that if a SIR member participates as a TMMI employee, they will not earn worker points for the event.

The board briefly reviewed Autocross #7, which was enjoyed by all. New event marshal Paul Blaylock was pleased that there were challenges for every level of driver. However, it was felt that the finish was too fast. Minor changes to the course from design to implementation made a major impact on the finish speed. Solo Safety Stewards should have been more attentive to this potential issue. Perhaps in the future, a test run might be made before the course is opened for competition.

The board also reviewed the September 11 rally. Everyone finished the course and had a good time. Kudos to Ben Davis for a good afternoon and the clever routing that allowed him to work all the checkpoints solo! In new business, Dave invited MacKenzi Crowe to talk about women in the SCCA. As she learned in Lincoln, SCCA is keen to engage more participation by women. SIR is equally keen to have more female participation, particularly in Autocross. She has several ideas, including a women-drivers only autocross, social events, and setting women up in teams of 3. MacKenzi has been nominated for a Ladies Scholarship from the SCCA that will pay to help improve her car for competition! She has nominated other SCCA women for the same scholarship. She would like to do some targeted communication to get women together for ideas and events. Dave moved to formally create a committee to investigate and advance interest and opportunities for women in SIR, to be led by MacKenzi Crowe. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously. Congratulations, MacKenzi! With the autocross season over, the board looked at issues and opportunities for 2017.

- Regarding points, should a slow driver score better than a driver who was unable to get a timed run in a
 heat? Perhaps it is time to move the minimum score to a flexible number related to the low score of the day,
 say 100 points less, instead of the fixed 750. Paul Dornburg will crunch some numbers prior to November's
 board meeting.
- Car/class numbers: the board needs to emphasize the rules: the numbers and class letters to be easily readable on both sides of the car. This includes using high-contrast colors, like black print on a white field.
- Action: Penalty/DNF calls from the course need to be passed along to drivers in grid.
- Patch Party: a focus on the start and finish areas would create more course options.
- Speed: As discussed earlier, a test run with perhaps a radar gun could be used to check potential (overly) speedy sections.

Nominations for the 2017 Board will be accepted at next week's membership meeting. Dave will include that information in the email reminder.

The awards banquet is set for Friday, December 2 (a correction will be made on the website which shows it as the 4th). Show-up time is 6:30, please - not earlier! The average cost for the event is \$53 a person; the club usually

subsidizes about \$600 of the total. Following discussion of, it was decided to set the price at \$40 for non-beef entrees, and \$45 for beef.

In upcoming events, highlights will from Nationals will be shown at next week's membership meeting. Steve Yockey is putting the finishing touches on the final two Rallies for the season, both to start north of Evansville. After discussion, it was decided to keep the November 27 date on the calendar for a Roberts Park autocross event. Terry Davis will talk to the Parks Department asap for permissions, etc.

Dave encouraged folks to begin planning for 2017 nationals. In addition, SCCA is looking for speakers at the annual convention in January (in Las Vegas) to talk about local rally programs. A 45-minute presentation is requested; Dave will forward the email to the board.

As there was no further business, the meeting adjourned on motion and vote.

Membership Meeting

October 11, 2016

Regional Executive Dave Lehrschall called the meeting to order and welcomed visitors and members alike. Officer reports were received: Secretary Lora Blaylock noted that the September minutes have been corrected to reflect that MacKenzi Crowe came in 8th in her class in Lincoln, not 10th as was originally recorded. Treasurer Bob Sonntag reported that the club has funds, and more than we did last month. Activities Chair Paul Blaylock reported that although Autocross season has ended, two rallies remain. Paul Dornburg requested articles for *Pit Stop*, and encouraged writers to get submissions in well before the last Wednesday of the month. Assistant Activities Chair Jr Crowe and Assistant Regional Executive Richard Grav reported that they were exceedingly glad to be in attendance. Dave reported that the board has voted to create a new committee to generate ideas and interest in getting more women involved in SIR activities, which MacKenzi Crowe will lead.

In event reviews, it was noted that the September 11 rally (trophies to be awarded in November), went very well. There were no problems, and all had a good time getting to the finish! Rookie Autocross designer Paul Blaylock was pleased with the results of his autocross, #7, "You're in the Driver's Seat": the weather was excellent, and drivers of every ability had a good time and a challenge from some element on the course.

Two rallies are upcoming, both prepared by team Yockey. The "Spooky Rally" on October 23 will begin at the Donut Bank in Princeton. Rally #7, on November 6th, starts and ends at the Dairy Queen restaurant in Ft. Branch and will feature a quicker pace than normal, as that is the first day of Daylight Saving time, and it will be dark earlier than most of us would like!

Paul Dornburg presented awards for his September autocross, "Tetris." Only 9 cones were hit all day! Tetris used the same course as the TMMI event the day before, which was a good fundraiser for the club. Lots of positive comments were received from the TMMI participants, some of whom returned for the Sunday event. Paul Gibson won the day in C Street with a 2 run indexed time of 42.196. The fastest single run of the day was by Paul Dornburg: 23.801! Whew!

Key factors in readability are contrast, size (height, width, and stroke) and font.
