The potential success of these programs is set up by the off-season planning, hard work, and communications efforts of our member volunteers. Our actual success comes because of SIR members' and potential members' participation in our events. I must add that I'm not talking about just showing up. We're all competitors and finishing well is really important to us all. It's the sharing and mutual support of the other competitors that brings the many of us back and encourages the weekend member to join our organization.

While on the subject of pride and the SIR, I want to remind everyone of an upcoming event that the SIR and SCCA are supporting. MacKenzi Crowe has stepped up to a challenge presented at last year's Solo Nationals to develop more opportunities of interest to SCCA women. Well, MacKenzi has done her part. She has planted the seeds for a growing Women of SIR group and is promoting a Ladies Autocross event which will take place Saturday, June 10, from 9:30 am - 4:30 pm at the Mid-American Air Center. I want to call upon our SIR men to support this event as we've supported TMMI events. Workers may get a sneak preview of the course for the next day's Autocross. We're looking for Safety Stewards, course workers, and possibly "coaches" although this would be by invitation only. We plan to limit the registration to 60 drivers. The cost will be \$30 for members and \$50 for non-members. Non-members can compete the next day for just \$30 if they participate in this event. At the time of this writing, we have had two successful Rally events and a well-attended Autocross event preceded by a fun Test and Tune event at the MAAC. The work done by our Patch Party teams has already paid off. The Test and Tune and the Autocross events' courses were smoother and wider thanks to the efforts of all, who participated. Along with the Ladies Only Autocross set for June 10th, we have the Ice Cream Rally scheduled for June 4th. This is my favorite Rally of the year. This is setup with long stretches of drives on beautifully maintained Kentucky back-roads. It's always a fun Rally and everyone gets Ice Cream at the end! We'll have a points Autocross on June 11th following Mackenzi's event the day before. SIR SCCA Board of Directors Meeting May 2, 2017

Present: Dave Lehrschall, Regional Executive; Richard Grav, Assistant Regional Executive; Paul Blaylock, Activities Chair; Jr Crowe, Assistant Activities Chair; Bob Sonntag, Treasurer; Lora Blaylock, Secretary; Paul Dornburg, *Pit Stop*; MacKenzi Crowe, Women of SIR; Terry Davis, Stacy Grav, guests

Regional Executive Dave welcomed everyone to the meeting and called for officer reports. Treasurer Bob reported that the club has spent \$928.29 so far on patch party activities. He expects we'll spend another \$1,500 on concrete and the insurance bill is soon due. New loaner helmets are on the way and will cost under \$500 total. Paul Dornburg reported that Pit Stop will go to press as soon as the RE report is available. MacKenzi reported that the Women of SIR will not meet in May, as work and vacation schedules have her away for most of the month. She is working with Paul Dornburg on the ladies' autocross course. Promotion of the June ladies' event is already circulating on Facebook, and an RSVP address of mackenzi_02@hotmail.com will be added to the information. Assistant RE Richard will take the ladies' event information and make it a feature on the website; Paul Dornburg will help share the information with nearby region's Facebook pages. Dave reported that he continues to receive Divisional emails and reports that often include event information, but likely not information that needs to be shared on the SIR website. He will be sure to share any items of interest to SIR. He also reported that the Test and Tune event is ready to go.

Dig Day at the MAAC saw 41 holes dug and readied for concrete in a good amount of time. The big storm of this past weekend blew our marker pylons everywhere. Many thanks to Bob for heading up there yesterday and replacing them all. It is expected we will need 13 yards of concrete to complete the work. The holes will need to be blown out, as significant rain is expected before Saturday. Our current blower has broken down and been taken to Yancey for repair, but do we need to buy a new one? Following discussion, it was moved, seconded, and approved to repair the current blower and buy a new one from Yancey. The Gravs will pick up both units before Saturday. (Thanks!) Bob will pick up the sealer, bonding agent, and rollers. (Thanks!) Terry and Dave will bring big sprayers. (Thanks!)

MacKenzi is in good shape for June 10th's Ladies' Autocross. Dave noted that he will be away on the date, but is happy to provide any needed help before then. A flyer to hand out and hang up is being worked on. Please be sure to share emails and the Facebook event far and wide. There will be a minimum of 20 and maximum of 60 entrants.

Richard noted that he has been in contact with a food truck that may be interested in providing eats at autocrosses. Bobe's is well known in the area and would provide BBQ type fare for sale. Richard will follow up, and if they are interested, we'll let folks know that lunch will be available for purchase on site. We'll do a trial run on test and tune weekend and evaluate.

Autocross Event Marshal and Rally Master slots are largely filled. There may be one autocross opportunity and one late-season rally available. Paul Blaylock is confident that all events will be covered without any trouble.

Dave has confirmed that TMMI is discussing having us put on an Autocross for them on September 16. If TMMI decides they want to go this, it will be promoted more widely than in previous years at TMMI.

Waiver changes and details were confirmed in discussion. Paul Dornburg will forward an email with all the pertinent details.

In New Business, the By-Law committee reported that they are not prepared to offer changes to the general membership for vote this month. There were few changes suggested, mostly pertaining to consistency and pronoun usage.

Dave expressed deep thanks for the material support from Memmer Tile for the Patch Parties. Our use of their water barrels and pumps makes a big job significantly easier. Perhaps a card signed by members and/or a printed thank you with their logo in *Pit Stop* would be an appropriate way to express our appreciation. Dave also reported that SIR member John Memmer is 'living the dream' racing and teaching people how to drive supercars.

SIR Member Barry Schonberger has framed a MAAC auto race print to be presented to the Airport as a thank you for their continued support. We will get it to MAAC officials later this month. We have heard that Bowler may be interested in having us put on an event for them again after a multi-year hiatus. Paul will be in touch with Mark Bowler about this.

Dave reported that he has prepared a Rally Challenge exercise as the program for this month's membership meeting.

As there was no further business, it was moved and voted to adjourn.

SIRSCCA Membership Meeting Minutes May 9, 2017

Regional Executive Dave Lehrschall welcomed all to the meeting and called for officer reports. Treasurer Bob Sonntag noted that the club is operating in the black despite expecting a \$1,500 invoice for concrete. The club also has purchased a new backpack blower as well as loaner helmets. Activities Chair Paul Blaylock reported that points are now updated and available online, and apologizes for the delay. He thanked Paul Dornburg for filling the open June Rally Master slot and team Davis/Sonntag for leading the November rally. Paul Dornburg reported that *Pit Stop* is now on its way to mailboxes with a special article on the Bonus Program for Autocross.

Paul Blaylock presented the trophies for his and the season's inaugural rally, "Brew to Bru". A gorgeous spring day saw 9 cars compete, with everyone visiting every checkpoint while making their way to the Bru Burger Bar in downtown Evansville. Team Davis/Sonntag took the trophy for A class with a one leg score of .067 (!), but it was Team Roales/Roales who won the day and B class with a total score of 251. The challengers in the guest class did well; they signed up for the event after attending that morning's Cars and Coffee event at the Green River Road Donut Bank.

The Club's patch party efforts had mostly good luck with the weather this year, only having to postpone fill day by a week. 41 holes were dug and later filled with 13 yards of concrete. A huge thanks to all who helped with this year's efforts to keep our racing surface in excellent condition.

The Women of SIR's first ladies-only autocross will take place on Saturday, June 10. MacKenzi Crowe has been working hard to prepare a course as well as promote the event. Workers will be needed (much like a Bowler or TMMI style event), with expectation that there will be time for the workers to take fun runs at the end of the event. Workers and competitors should RSVP to mackenzi_02@hotmail.com.

Dave reminded all that SIR will focus on current vehicle identification rules this year. If you have questions as to whether your vehicle is properly identified, or if you need to confirm your number and class, please send an email to numbers@sirscca.org. If you ran last year, that number is reserved for you. If your class has changed, or you want a new number, please send an email asap.

In upcoming events, the group was reminded of this month's Test and Tune event on Saturday, May 20. It will feature a short course including a constant-rate turn and two differently spaced slaloms. Bring your winter vehicle updates to the MAAC and test them out and make final adjustments before the autocross season begins the next day. The Sunday course will build on and expand Saturday's course.

Also happening before the club meets again is Rally #2, Paul Dornburg's famous Ice Cream Rally in Owensboro. This is always an excellent event, and the winners receive sprinkles on their ice cream at the end! See you at the Dairy Queen on 4th Street in Owensboro on Sunday, June 4!

SIR Member Barry Schonberger has framed a large copy of the old Lawrenceville race poster to be presented to MAAC officials later this month. Racing events have been held near and at the MAAC site since the mid-1930s. Smaller copies are also available for purchase. Contact Barry for your new garage decoration today!

Dave presented a Tabletop Rally Challenge for the assembly. Class B was challenged only to get to the correct finish point, while class A required figuring out how long it took to get to the end. Dave reminded all that following the correct route is 90% of rally success. All did well on this fun exercise.

Dave Lehrschall won the door prize, after which, the meeting adjourned on motion and vote.

SIR/SCCA 2017 Bonus Program

Who's Eligible?

All event participants are eligible. SIR or SCCA membership is not required.

Program Description

Those working a qualifying activity (determined by the SIR/SCCA board) are entitled to one extra run in each heat of an SIR/SCCA autocross. These "bonus runs" are scored and count like any other run. The expected result is that those that have worked all of the qualifying events will have eight (8) runs in a typical autocross and those that have not qualified for the bonus program will have only six (6). Those qualified for only a single bonus run must take the bonus run in the first heat or forfeit it.
