Carolyn Dornburg's "Brunch Rally" was a big hit. We had a nice turnout of 10 rally teams in spite of the early rain. We started with a nice brunch buffet at Owensboro's historic Windy Hollow restaurant and then set out on the nice Daviess County back-roads. I really enjoy those curvy, Kentucky back-roads.

Our next Rally will be held on September 10th. Bob Rothermel is the Rally Master for this event. The starting point is the Carousel restaurant at 5115 Monroe Ave. near Washington Square in Evansville. Tech and registration are scheduled to begin at our normal time, 12:30 pm CDT. The first car off should leave at approximately 1:00 PM. We will finish at about 4:30 PM.

The August 20th Autocross was a great time. As promised, Jr. Crowe served up a very interesting course design. He included three slaloms, a crossover, and some areas that are newly available this year thanks to our patch party teams. Each one of the slaloms included an option for starting left or right and different pacing between cones kept us on our toes while there were a couple of straight sections that gave us a chance to check rev-limiters. I mentioned last month that Jr. and I have had a long-running (friendly) Autocross competition going for a couple of years. We still have a good time swapping leads on the indexed times while encouraging each other to do the best we can. On Sunday, Jr. encouraged me to try something new. It worked and he gave me high five's when I got back to grid even though I had just moved ahead of him (temporarily). I like this about our events. We all want to finish well. We also want our competition to do well. Everyone is ready to help others. If you haven't been to an event in a while, come on out and experience this. Oh, the suggestion Jr. gave me? It was to turn off the last remaining level of "computer assistance" and put the car where I wanted it, not where the computer wanted it to be in terms of traction. I found nearly two seconds with Jr's help. (He still beat me).

We have another TMMI – SIR Autocross planned for September 16th. Volunteers will receive Berry Points, a probable opportunity to run the course after the TMMI scored runs, and a good look at the next day's SIR points autocross. Paul Dornburg is the scheduled Event Chairman. The following day will be autocross points event #6 to be run on a course similar to the TMMI event.

The Bylaws team has put together what we believe are some needed updates to our current Bylaws document. These potential changes will be reviewed in our September membership meeting. As we look ahead to our October meeting you'll want to begin thinking of who you might want to nominate for your Southern Indiana Region Board of Directors. Don't forget that it's okay to nominate yourself.

It's time for our SIR contingent's trip to Lincoln, Nebraska for the 2017 SCCA Solo Nationals. Wish us luck!

Our next meeting will be held at Smitty's Italian Steakhouse in Evansville on Tuesday, September 12, 2017. We'll gather around 6:00 PM for bench-racing, begin eating around 6:30, and then start the meeting at about 7:30 PM (Central). We hope to see you there.

SIR SCCA Board of Directors Meeting August 1, 2017

Present: Dave Lehrschall, Regional Executive; Paul Blaylock, Activities Chair; Jr Crowe, Assistant Activities Chair; Bob Sonntag, Treasurer; Lora Blaylock, Secretary; Paul Dornburg, *Pit Stop*; MacKenzi Crowe, Women of SIR; Terry Davis, guest

Regional Executive Dave called the meeting to order. welcoming all. It was moved, seconded, and agreed to accept the June minutes as printed in Pit Stop. Treasurer Bob noted that the club's finances are in good order. Activities Chair Paul Blaylock noted that rookie Rallymaster Bob Rothermel is looking for help with his September rally. Paul will follow up with him. Assistant AC Jr said that he's 'getting by' with tech, but it's still not as smooth a process as he wants. Perhaps moving tech to a single point would work better than going from car to car. Jr will consider doing this for the next event. The Numbering system is not yet perfect, but is getting better. Dave, who filled in at tech for the last autocross, will go through the recent results and see where we can improve. Paul Dornburg will send a list of recent autocrossers to Dave so he can update the available number list. Dave will also write a reminder about putting class letters with the car number, as well as to visit the registration window! Paul Dornburg updated the email list and sent invitations to recent non-member autocross attendees. We have had 7 or 8 folks join after being directly invited; our current membership number is 132, including 5-6 recently expired folks. Pit Stop is available digitally, and should be in mailboxes by Friday. MacKenzi is 'damn glad' to be in attendance. Dave reported meeting Gary Hall, a MAAC board member, at the last autocross; Gary took a ride-along and seemed enthusiastic and supportive of SIR events.

In Old Business, the new bump order seems to be working fine. The July membership meeting had excellent attendance, and went really well. Dave will keep pushing meeting attendance.

Dave has been persistent in getting TMMI to promote the September 16 autocross. He will propose a signup up deadline of September 8 and solicit a list of volunteers, who (unless they are a TMMI participant) will earn Berry points.

The Crowes reported that Wings, Inc. from Princeton might be interested in providing food for autocrosses, but they would need orders in advance as they do not have a food truck setup. The board agreed that this was not the fit they were looking for.

In recent events, the second autocross of the season went well. Folks are giving a good response to the more 'open' usage of course space. We need to be sure to wait until blowing is finished before marking the course, but not so long as to forget to mark it at all!

In new business, Dave noted that he does not plan much outside award presentation and socializing for the August membership meeting at the Log Inn. RSVP reminders will continue to go out, and will include a note that the Log Inn does not take credit cards.

Paul Dornburg has been coordinating credit card payments at events recently. It has gone smoothly. He will work with Dave, Terry, and Paul Blaylock to get them set up to take event payments via Square. He will also make sure Bob has the login name and password for the account.

Looking ahead, new officer nomination will happen at the October membership meeting. The Board will discuss possible nominees at the next BoD meeting.

The Bylaws team has been working via email and expects to present changes to the membership at the

September meeting to be voted on the following month. The board will review a PowerPoint of the changes at the next BoD meeting.

The Board next discussed 2018 dues. Although the club does not currently have a 'rainy day' fund, the equipment is in good shape, there are plenty of new pylons in storage, and cash flow is quite sufficient. In the light of this good news, it was agreed that dues would remain the same.

There has been some discussion lately of a need for Port-A-Pots at the MAAC. Are more attendees putting a strain on the MAAC's hospitality? The cost for two port-a-pots would be around \$200 for a weekend. It was decided to watch attendance numbers and restroom need for the next few events. More break time can always be added if we have a large crowd.

In upcoming events, the Brunch Rally scheduled for this Sunday is all set to go. Paul Dornburg suggests if folks are planning to eat brunch to arrive around 11:15. Jr's autocross on August 20 is also ready to go.

The first week of September will see at least 9 members, many of whom are also SIR officers, attend the SOLO Nationals. Due to the conflict, the September board meeting will occur one week early, on August 29.

As there was no further business, the meeting adjourned.

SIRSCCA Membership Meeting Minutes August 8, 2017 Log Inn, Warrenton, IN

Regional Executive Dave Lehrschall welcomed all to the meeting, thanking everyone for their attendance. He encouraged all to enjoy an extended time of fellowship, and of course, plenty of the Log Inn's famous fried chicken and sides.

Awards for Autocross #3, Richard Grav's "Solo Tire Shredder" were presented. 36 entrants completed in 14 separate classes, including two Ladies' classes. Proving sometimes you only need one run to win, Bob Sonntag laid down the fastest time of the day in his Blue Legrand with a 40.980. D&F Prepared had 5 entrants with Richard Grav and Jr Crowe, both in the Black Solstice, taking home trophies. Barry Beaman and Don Kelly were neck-and-neck in B Street, putting down a 43.070 and 43.179, respectively.

Terry Davis' Autocross #4, "Pure Chicanery" had 33 contestants in 14 classes, including again, two Ladies' classes. Fastest time of the day was recorded by by Aaron Miller in the red Evo in A Street prepared with a 39.610. Many drivers took advantage of the minimum 2-entrant feature in the club's new bumping scheme, as 5 classes featured cars with two drivers, making for good competition, as demonstrated by Chad and Gary Griffith, competing in the Blue Mustang in A Street; their best times were 45.607 and 46.981, respectively.
