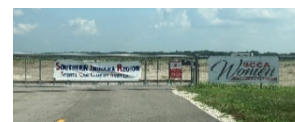

There have been times when I wondered if I really had any "news" to report in our Southern Indiana Region's Pit Stop. This spring has presented a greater challenge as our events are on hold due to the COVID-19 quarantine restrictions, and we have spent an incredible amount of time in isolation. I will not dwell on the virus. I believe most of us need a break from the widespread analysis and guesswork. I only ask that you keep an eye on our SIR website and Facebook page for renewed event schedule updates.

I have used the time off to design the first "points" autocross following a route that works with our current airport surface condition. I was so proud of it that I mapped out each of the 31 features I had included and calculated how fast I should be if I drove my car as well as Car and Driver thinks it should perform while accelerating, turning, and braking. I have been collecting lots of really neat numbers with my track addict app over the last couple of years, but I had not thought about how those numbers might compare to a run I should have made.

I really believe that understanding what you and your vehicle might do while navigating standard autocross features makes a complete course easier to understand and driving strategies more effective. Thinking about this as you walk the course features and transitions should help you to become more competitive. There is a wealth of information out there that can help you with this. I have referred to the SCCA Solo rule book (which is free on the SCCA website) and the Cornering Speeds chart in section 2.2. This little gem is worth more than a little study. If you do so, you might notice that there is little time advantage for a capable vehicle running 19 mph at 1.25 g's in a 90 degree turn having a (tight) 15 ft radius over a 1.0 g vehicle running the same turn at 17 mph. The 23 ft would be traveled in 0.825 seconds and 0.922 seconds respectively for a difference of only 0.097 seconds. Opening this 90-degree turn up to a 125 ft radius for the same two vehicles gives us a 1.25 g's run at 48 mph taking 2.784 seconds to travel the 196 feet and the 1.0 g vehicle running at 43 mph in 3.108 seconds for a more significant difference of 0.324 seconds.

What is the point? There are several. The greater cornering capability is a more significant advantage on a larger radius. "Carrying more speed" into that larger turn and exiting with more speed becomes more possible with that extra grip. The smaller radius turn makes everyone slow for the turn, the approach, and the exit speed. Braking and acceleration capability then become keys to success, especially if the entry and exit straights were lengthy. Am I advocating the elimination of small radius turns? No, I am not. I am suggesting that course designers should look at mixing small turns with large ones to test grip and driver skill and to also include feature to feature transitions (straights) that are long enough to test acceleration and braking planning. Most of all, I am suggesting that we all look at our course walks a little differently. If your vehicle has a turn g-force capability, acceleration, and braking capability that is significantly different than mine, we really should be walking the course planning to drive with different lines, brake points, and exit points.

I spent most of this article and the past week working on autocross ideas. I apologize to the rally folks. I did not mention anything about our rally program. I have a devious plan in this regard. Several of our recent rally masters have used the new GPS app for tracking rally participants. The system seems to offer a lot of advantages for both the rally master and participants. I am not up to speed yet on the GPS rally app. So (the devious part) I'm going to ask Paul or Carrie or Bob to offset this article's heavy autocross focus with a few paragraphs describing their new system experience from a rally master's or participant's perspective for the next Pit Stop.

We will have our May 2020 Southern Indiana Region's membership meeting on the 12th as scheduled. This meeting will be a Zoom, on-line meeting. I will open the meeting link at about 6:45 PM (Central). We will begin our meeting at 7:00 PM. This should be a closed meeting to SIR members and friends only. You should have received a Zoom meeting link from me on April 23rd. Rallying with GPS Checkpoints

As our lives and our club events are being disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic, I want to point out that Time/Speed/Distance rallying is a sport with social distancing built in. Entrants are started apart, ideally maintain that separation, and penalized for getting too close to either the car ahead or behind. (We typically use 2 minutes and FYI 6 feet at 30 MPH is .00227 minutes.) In nearly forty years with SIR/SCCA I have heard more “I need to be closer to so-and-so” at autocross events than rally events. I was tipped off to Dave’s devious plan. Wait no longer to fill a few minutes of isolation time reading this article on SIR’s early experiences with automated checkpoints.

One of the newest things in the world of Time/Speed/Distance (TSD) rallying is the Richta GPS Check-point system. The Richta system consists of three components. Two are used by the rallymaster and third is used by the entrants. Paul Dornburg started us rolling with the system last year. I have used it for three rallies since then. Carrie Moore used it for our March rally.

For SIR/SCCA a major advantage of the system is that it provides a way for the club to run TSD rallies without having to find checkpoint workers. Too few of us participate in the rally program. The use of this system helps make the most of our limited worker resources. Ideally, those that would support our rally program by working a checkpoint will now be entering our events. A byproduct of the GPS checkpoint system is that it allows for more checkpoints and checkpoints to be placed where there is no room to position a checkpoint crew. More checkpoints make for shorter legs. Shorter legs can make for better checkpoint scores. Paul’s app testing route had thirteen checkpoints. Carrie’s *Westside Something* had ten. The February 29th *Strive to Be Average* rally had 48 scored legs in 59 of its 72 miles. (The other 13 miles were the odometer check’s free zone.) Using the Richta system does not mean our rallies must have more than our normal three to five checkpoints. My first rally with the app, *Parks and Rec*, had only four checkpoints.

Rally teams must devote an Apple or Android device to running the Competitor app. After the Competitor app is running on the device and the car is registered for the rally, the device no longer needs Internet access. As each checkpoint is passed, the app sounds and displays the team’s checkpoint score. Instant feedback and official scores while you are still on the route. That is pretty darn cool! If the device is connected to the Internet, the information is available in near real-time to the rallymaster.

Rally masters use the Rallymaster component of the system to define rally legs and checkpoint locations. This app also accumulates the checkpoint scores. It even has a map screen that shows checkpoint locations and real-time position of those cars with the Competitor app connected to the Internet.

The third app, Scoreboard, gives the state of the rally by displaying the number of completed legs and checkpoint scores for each rally team as teams run the route.

When all rally cars and the rallymaster are connected to the Internet during an event, the system works as described above and those with access to the rally in Rallymaster or the Scoreboard apps can watch the rally as it progresses. When the Competitor app is not connected to the Internet, the information is stored on the entrant’s device and uploaded when the device is next connected to the Internet.

We have frequently been forced to run rallies with single-worker checkpoints using only the rally-master’s normal rally team for workers. The Richta GPS Checkpoint system allows our rally masters to add a little more fun through thinking differently about checkpoints. Hopefully, we will also add a few more entrants to our rallies too. All that while saving rally masters the troubles of finding checkpoint workers and fretting over being able to beat rally cars to checkpoints. That’s pretty darn cool too!

Event registration going forward

As mentioned on page 1 all registration for all events will be done on www.motorsportreg.com

One will need to set up an account on MSR with your SCCA information as well as some other data. Registration closing date will be in the description of each event on MSR. One will enter payment information but will not be charged until after the event. That way if you are unable to get to the event, we will not have to process a refund.

At autocrosses we have loaned helmets, but we only have 6 helmets. Helmets will be loaned on a first come first serve basis. We strongly suggest you purchase your own helmet to avoid contamination issues or that you find out too late that the helmets have been spoken for. The guidelines for helmet certification can be found here on the SCCA website: <https://www.scca.com/downloads/48190-2020-solo-helmet-certification-labels-2019-11-08/download> It will download the helmet certification chart.

If you do borrow a helmet for an event you will not share it with anyone else and you will disinfect it after returning it. We will have disinfectant on site. You should know your helmet size and that can be found by googling "helmet sizing chart" and reading the chart.

We strongly suggest that SCCA members fill out an annual waiver form. Download this form IN COLOR and bring it to the event. <https://www.scca.com/downloads/14418-scca-adult-annual-waiver-1306-01-16/download> We will take the form and submit it to the SCCA and they will issue a hard card for the year. You must have a headshot in your SCCA profile for the hard card to be issued so make sure you have created your account and have uploaded a picture to your profile.

Also note that time schedules may change for events. In some cases, entry to the autocross site will only be for a limited period. Rallies may be scheduled for a day without a time frame so one can do the rally at their leisure.
