## **July RE Report**



I was so ready for this week! We have dates set for our first, second, and third Southern Indiana Region points autocross events for 2020. We have created an event plan that, given everyone does their part, should keep participants and those with whom they might come into contact as safe from the COVID-19 virus as they can be. Our connection to Motorsportreg.com including Paul Dornburg's custom developed SIR registration routine, members' database, and event text documents is functioning and shows our event registration numbers steadily growing. It's time to uncover or trailer those specialty vehicles or do whatever you need to do to your daily-driver, because this weekend is all about working those pedals, making those turns, and controlling the urge to scream because your hair feels like it's on fire!!! I realize this part only works for those of you, who still have hair, but I still feel the tingle).

Struts, sway-bar, brakes, alignment were done several months ago. This week I neatened-up the power cable routing for the GoPro, mounted the autocross tires / wheels, and installed the shoulder harnesses. As mentioned on page 1 all registration for all events will be done on www.motorsportreg.com

One will need to set up an account on MSR with your SCCA information as well as some other data. Registration closing date will be in the description of each event on MSR. One will enter payment information but will not be charged until after the event. That way if you are unable to get to the event, we will not have to process a refund. If you already have an account, make sure you update the "region of record" field with our region.

At autocrosses we have loaned helmets, but we only have 7 helmets. Helmets will be loaned on a first come first serve basis. We strongly suggest you purchase your own helmet to avoid contamination issues or that you find out too late that the helmets have been spoken for. The guidelines for helmet certification can be found here on the SCCA website: https://www.scca.com/downloads/48190-2020-solo-helmet-certification-labels-2019-11-08/download It will download the helmet

certification chart.

If you do borrow a helmet for an event you will not share it with anyone else and you will disinfect it after returning it. We will have disinfectant on site. You should know your helmet size and that can be found by googling "helmet sizing chart" and reading the chart.

We strongly suggest that SCCA members fill out an annual waiver form. Download this form IN COLOR and bring it to the event. https://www.scca.com/downloads/14418-scca-adult-annual-waiver-1306-01-16/download We will take the form and submit it to the SCCA and they will issue a hard card for the year. You must have a headshot in your SCCA profile for the hard card to be issued so make sure you have created your account and have uploaded a picture to your profile.

Also note that time schedules may change for events. In some cases, entry to the autocross site will only be for a limited period.

## Road Racing with GFR

There is a saying when trouble happens outside of your control: "That's racing!" Since the last club racing update, SIR member Gabe Fehribach has competed in two events: a Hoosier Racing Tire SCCA Super Tour event at World Wide Technology Raceway (formerly known as Gateway Motorsports Park) in Madison, IL and a Detroit SCCA Regional event at Waterford Hills Raceway near Pontiac. MI.

At WWTR, in the second test/practice session on Friday just before lunch Gabe's CV joint failed. To understand if the new, more powerful motor is a cause the SCCA requested that we send the failed part to them for analysis to see if upgraded CV joints would be necessary. At the time of writing, we have not heard the results of the analysis. After the quick repair (kudos to Alliance Autosport), he headed back out after lunch, but another problem soon cropped up: the oval was putting a strain on his neck from the sustained g-forces. Team owner and six-time national champion Scott Rettich complained of this problem, too. Unlike the Spec Racer Ford chassis, the Formula Enterprises 2 (FE2) chassis does not have an option for a head surround support for tall drivers. At 6'1" Gabe reported feeling like a bobble head on track. With a very sore neck, Saturday would see Gabe finish 4th in class and 5th overall. Overnight, the team developed what they called a "pillow" (complete with Z's written on it to bring in a bit of humor) to fit under his helmet to support his head. To add to the problems, Rettich likened WWTR's racing surface to a cheese grater so the team swapped tires side to side on all three FE2's for Sunday's race. With his pillow in place, Gabe would set faster lap times in Sunday gualifying and was ready to attack in Race 2, but that's when things took a tough turn for the rookie. During lap 2 of the race, he noticed his rear end was getting horribly loose, so much so that his lap times were falling but he toughed it out. Following the race where Gabe again finished 4th in class and 5th overall, the team found his left rear tire only had 5 lbs. of air in it! A few team members commented in amazement that Gabe was able to keep it out of the oval's wall. The problem: a leaking valve stem. On a positive note, he came away with some valuable Super Tour points. On to the next weekend.

Things went far better at Waterford Hills Raceway for the young racer and the 9 car. Each practice session would see him setting faster and faster lap times as he learned the newly repaved permanent road course. Gabe would go on to qualify 7th of 18 overall (2nd in class) on Saturday morning against mostly local racers intimately familiar with the track. In race 1 he would go on to finish 6th (2nd in class). Race 2 on Sunday morning would see him start 6th of 16 and finish 5th. The feature race on Sunday afternoon would see him start 5th of 16, fall to 6th at one point, but make two on-track passes to finish 4th overall after setting his personal best lap of the weekend on the 2nd-to-last lap. All-in-all, a good weekend.

The rookie's next event will be another Hoosier Racing Tire SCCA Super Tour event at Mid-Ohio in mid-July.

Our first autocross of the year dawned sunny and warm with a chance of stray thunderstorms. Our Solo Safety Stewards had their lightning apps pulled up and were waiting for any indication of a threat. Runs got underway about 11:30 am for the 33 drivers on hand. Dave's course started from the area near the terminal and ran clockwise. After the first heat Shawn Lansdale had the quickest raw time (45.3) followed closely by Jeff Jackson (45.5), Richard Grav (46.2), John McCarthy (46.4) and Ernie Roales (46.6). The indexed results showed Jeff Jackson first (37.4) followed by Ernie Roales (37.5), John McCarthy (38.0), MacKenzi Crowe (38.9), and Shawn Lansdale (39.1). Heat 2 took to the course and after their 3 runs there was a new leader in raw time, Paul Dornburg (43.2), followed by Shawn Lansdale (45.3), Jr. Crowe (45.4), Jeff Jackson (45.5), and Brandon Porambo (45.5). The leader in indexed times was now Brandon (35.54) followed by Paul (35.57), Jr. (37.0), Barry Beaman (37.2), and Jeff (37.4). The skies to the west began to darken as the 3<sup>rd</sup> heat got underway. Dornburg stayed fastest after heat 3 was done followed by Richard Grav, now driving Mike Mounlio's Audi after his "new to him" A Mod car broke. Mike, Shawn, and Jeff were third through fifth, respectively. In the indexed times Brandon still lead Paul while Jr. jumped up to third followed by Jeff and Mike. As heat 4 was lining up in grid the skies darkened considerably. Runs started and the first two sets were completed before the rain began in earnest. A few got their third run but 11 of the 16 did not before the skies opened up. A solid 30 minutes of rain flooded the site and the event was called complete. You can see the results on page 7.

Day 2 of our double header weekend was another sunny warm day with less threat of bad weather although a big storm passed us by to the south. Dave's course started and finished in the same place but had a crossover early in the run which had the drivers going counterclockwise around most of the course. It would take a bit longer for each run but there were only 26 drivers after some Saturday car carnage. We got started on time but some issues with wet timing cables delayed us for about a half and hour. The timers would trip without a car breaking the beams. We dug through our boxes of stuff and found 2 dry cables and got the system working. Then we stretched out the wet cables to dry in the sun.

After heats 1 and 2 were complete the Porsche contingent had the top 3 spots. Paul Dornburg (2018 Cayman GTS) had a 43.1, Jr. Crowe (2006 Cayman S) had a 44.5 and Jeff Jackson (2006 911 GTS) had a 44.9. Honda S2000 drivers Don Kelley and Barry Beaman were 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> respectively with 44.4 and 44.6. Indexed times had Paul first with a 35.5, followed by Jr. (36.2), Don (36.7), Jim Cannon, in Ernie's Civic (36.91) and Barry (36.95).

Heats 3 and 4 went off without a hitch and Paul kept the top spot in raw times with a 42.9, turned in on his last run. Jr. was second with a 44.5, Jim Cannon got to third (44.7) as he became more familiar with the Civic, Jeff was fourth (44.9) while Barry was fifth (45.3). The indexed results showed Paul again guickest with a 35.3 followed by the ever-improving Jim Cannon with a 36.0. Third through fifth were Jr. (36.2), Barry (36.72) and Dave Lehrschall, in his gorgeous 2020 Mustang, (36.76) Complete autocross points results are on the next page.

These results are calculated by taking the entrants quickest time from their first heat and adding them to their quickest time from their second heat, then multiplying by their class index number. The quickest time driver gets 1000 points while everyone else gets less when measured against the quickest time. Dornburg's 2 quickest runs from each heat are highlighted with a box.
