Unfortunately, most of the participants have been board members, who are already aware of these change details and are already prepared to register and follow the new guidelines.

Please take advantage of these informational offerings to become informed and prepared. We do not want to turn anyone away, but there will be no exceptions to the online pre-registration policy.

# **August RE Report**



I am so proud to be a member of the Southern Indiana Region of the Sports Car Club of America! Last month I wrote about our plans to start our compressed Rally and Autocross calendars and to manage these events in a manner that, hopefully, would keep us protected from the COVID-19 virus. As usual, the SIR members stepped up, accepted the challenges, and made it work. We now have three points events in the books for both our 2020 Rally and Autocross championship seasons!

The changes we have made to events' management have been significant. In some cases, we have had to throw out older, comfortable processes. While this may have added moments of frustration and extra work, I believe the benefits of these changes for the SIR will carry-over long after we have said, "Good-bye", to the threat of COVID-19. Online pre-registration, membership verification, license checks, and

payment has eliminated\* ill-timed event managers' work. The new pre-registration has made event prep more efficient and quicker benefitting these workers and participants.

I cannot fly through the benefits of online events registrations without clarifying my earlier note on "eliminated work". None of the work has gone away. We are still covering all the normal detail and requirements plus our new COVID-19 guidelines. It is just being managed differently. Paul Dornburg has been managing Our MotorSportReg.com connections. This has required a lot of trial and error as he set up brand new SIR-specific event details, created software routines, and coordinated the business relationship between the SIR and MSR. He has watched over each event's registrations as our members learned the registration routines. Much of this work including the continuous monitoring of registrations and interfacing with MSR will need to continue. (Workload balance and assignments for our SIR officers will have to be re-examined and updated).

I cannot skip through discussions of beneficial changes without mentioning our Rally program. Bob Sonntag has been and continues to be, who I would call, our Rally Steward. He maintains communications with our SCCA Rally officials and more recently has established a running dialogue with the developers of a slick Time Speed Distance Rally software program, the Richta Rally Calculator. Bob has coached several of us through the setup of checkpoints that are identified by GPS locations. The benefits are great!

We just finished the (world famous) Ice Cream Rally where we ran through a few thunderstorms. You might imagine the discomfort the checkpoint workers went through ..., but wait, this system eliminates the need to put CP workers out there. As drivers pass a CP, the system records your time. It also gives you immediate feedback on your performance, leg by leg, and offers a slick time adjustment routine that allows adjustments for train crossing delays or other issues. We had 9 vehicles running in Sunday's Ice Cream Rally with 10 checkpoints. It was a blast! Normally, we would have had fewer checkpoints with at least 3 or 4 CP workers crisscrossing the area to manage 4 or 5 checkpoints. On Sunday, these potential workers were competing instead. Paul and Carolyn Dornburg managed the 10-checkpoint event and presented the results to the 9 teams right after sharing ice-cream treats.

I know that I don't need to remind you that we have a real-world pandemic to deal with. I do want to remind you to watch our website and postings and attend our Zoom meetings for updates.

We will plan on another Zoom meeting for our next membership meeting on August 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020, at 7:00 PM. The meeting invitation link and password will be sent to our SIR e-mail distribution two days beforehand. As mentioned on page 1 all registration for all events will be done on www.motorsportreg.com

One will need to set up an account on MSR with your SCCA information as well as some other data. Registration closing date will be in the description of each event on MSR. One will enter payment information but will not be charged until after the event. That way if you are unable to get to the event, we will not have to process a refund. If you already have an account, make sure you update the "region of record" field with our region.

At autocrosses we have loaner helmets, but we only have 7 helmets. Helmets will be loaned on a first come first serve basis. We strongly suggest you purchase your own helmet to avoid contamination issues or that you find out too late that the helmets have been spoken for. If you do borrow a helmet for an event you will not share it with anyone else and you will disinfect it after returning it. We will have disinfectant on site. You should know your helmet size and that can be found by googling "helmet sizing chart" and reading the chart.

We strongly suggest that SCCA members fill out an annual waiver form. You must have a headshot in your SCCA profile for the hard card to be issued so make sure you have created your account and have uploaded a picture to your profile.

Also note that time schedules may change for events. In some cases, entry to the autocross site will only be for a limited period.

The 2020 version of Ernie Roales "Quick & Dirty" autocross was held on a warm but overcast day at the Mid-American Air Center. I'll not bore you with a run by run description but instead will urge you to look at the Autocross points for the last 3 events to see if your favorite driver has been improving. Note the points value for AX1 per driver and see if the number increases with each event. That indicates improvement at each event. (the points are on the next page)

In the top 10, for example, Jr. Crowe has been edging closer to Paul Dornburg each event with scores of 958, 973, and 979. Can we predict a 986 for the next event? Barry Beaman has been consistent with 949, 960, and 960. Don Kelley, Ernie Roales, Dave Lehrschall, and Steve Backer improved from AX1 to AX2 but fell back a little bit with AX3. John McCarthy was consistent AX1 to AX2 and improved in AX3. MacKenzi Crowe improved AX1 to AX2 but fell off a little in AX3. It's hard to figure out Jim Cannon's scores because he may not be in the same car at each event. AX1 he was in his Miata, AX2 in Ernie's Honda, and AX3 he was in his Acura. BTW, we may be changing the formula for determining AX points. The current formula determines the difference between your times and the quickest times and uses it to determine what percent of the quick time your time is. We're probably going to change it to your total time divided by the quickest total time. It is a lot easier to explain using that formula.

Another BTW is that we may boost the minimum points received to 800 versus the previous 750 value. Let us know what you think about that. Do you want a real value of your score or 800 points? (assuming you scored less than 800 points)

# Gabe Fehribach Racing – Heartbreaking and heartwarming news

On Sunday morning during the Hoosier Tire Super Tour feature race at Mid-Ohio, Gabe was involved in a horrific crash in his FE2 car.

Gabe was following car #29, another FE2 competitor, on lap 5 and got a better exit out of the famed keyhole onto the long backstretch. Using his exit speed and drafting, Gabe initiated a pass on the outside. Gabe had passed this same competitor on track for position on Saturday in his drive from 17th to 10th overall. But before reaching the braking zone at the end of the straight, the driver in the #29 veered left into Gabe causing Gabe's car to yaw right at over 120 mph. Then Gabe's right-rear wheel went over the left-front of the #29 car. This not only launched Gabe's car into the air, but into a barrel roll as well. When the car finished rolling, it was upside down and sliding with Gabe's helmet against the asphalt. The car continued to slide an estimated 100 feet eventually coming to a stop in the grass. Gabe was knocked unconscious but came to shortly after the medics arrived on scene. Extraction from the cockpit took longer than desired due to the car being inverted. After he was removed from the car, he was communicative, even requesting water. Before the ambulance arrived however, Gabe would lose consciousness at least one more time and would vomit twice; clear signs of a possible concussion. Gabe was then transported to the hospital where he received a full body CT scan. Miraculously the scan revealed no brain hemorrhaging nor any broken bones. Gabe was admitted to the hospital Sunday to be evaluated for his concussion the next day and would be released later in the day on Monday.

The racing stewards in their review found the driver of the #29 car to be fully at fault. That driver had his competition license suspended and has been put on probation. They then took his actual race license card away from him.

Fellow racers have reached out to Gabe to show their support of his recovery. Gabe says he wants to get back in the car. However, given the damage to his car it will likely be Spring 2021 before he can return to the track.
