

May RE Report



Last month I wished for sunshine and warmer weather, and we were blessed with both for our second road rally and our first autocross. I didn't get to go to the rally, but I did go to the autocross and even though it was warm the wind was fierce. Fierce can also describe the competition as the annual changes to the PAX numbers have tightened up the field. You should see the results in this edition of the newsletter.

Last month we were finally able to award the trophies to our 2021 Champions. At our monthly membership meeting, which is always on the 2nd Tuesday of the month except September, we handed out the Road Rally Trophy, the Autocross Trophy, the

Berry Points Trophy, the Rookie of the Year trophy, and plaques to the top 3 finishers in each competition. (Pictures on last pages)

Ernie and Sue Roales took home the Rally trophy with a 4-point advantage over Terry Davis and Bob Sonntag. Last year these 4 tied for first place but not in 2021. The Roales placed 1st in 5 of the 6 rallys they entered. Davis and Sonntag made all 7 rallys and garnered 1st in 4 of them but 3 sub-par results dropped them to 2nd in points. Tied for 3rd place were Harold and Karen Davis, and Rob Minton. Harold and Karen only entered 4 of the 7 rallys but placed first in 3 of them. Rob Minton, in his rookie year, made all the rallys and was able to tie the Davis' for 3rd.

In the race for the Autocross Trophy Paul Dornburg came out on top (again!) for his 4th consecutive championship and 10th overall. In 7 autocrosses he was 1st, 5 times. I came in 2nd just 2 points ahead of 3rd place Jon Schwartze.

The John Berry participation trophy was taken by Ernie Roales. Ernie said after losing by onepoint last year he decided to work at doing well in all our disciplines and let the points fall where they may. Well, they fell just right as he bested 2nd place Paul Dornburg by 5 points and 3rd place Bob Sonntag by 18.

The Rookie of the Year trophy had a tie for 1st place. Rob Minton and Cooper Wink tied with 24 points each out of a possible 66. They each received a plaque and will split possession of the traveling trophy.

Upcoming events include our 3rd road rally to be put on by Harold and Karen Davis. They've ventured to Evansville from their Terre Haute home to setup this event to be held on the 15th of May. Also, in May the club is running the Bowler Midwest Musclecar Challenge autocross at our course at Mid-American Air Center. We need workers for Friday and Saturday May 20th and 21st. SIR/SCCA Board Minutes for April 6th, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Regional Executive Jr. Crowe.

Board Reports

- Secretary ERnie read the minutes of the last Board meeting. A motion was made by Terry Davis to accept the minutes as read. A second was made by Bob Sonntag to accept the motion. The motion was passed.
- **Treasurer** Bob Sonntag reports that our balance on hand is \$11,632,94 which includes \$4,668 in entry fees for the Midwest Musclecar Challenge. All bills are paid.
- Activities Chairman Dave Lehrschall reports that all trophies are ready except the Rookie of the Year and the cost is \$695.42.
- Assistant Activities Chairman Barry Beaman had nothing to report.
- **Pit Stop** editor Paul Dornburg said the deadline for submissions is Wednesday April 27th.
- Women's Chairman Dawn Sturgeon had nothing to report.
- Advisor Terry Davis reported that all sanction applications are current.
- Assistant Regional Executive MacKenzi Payne-Crowe had nothing to report.
- **Regional Executive** Jr. Crowe had nothing to report.

Old Business

- Canceling the Snow Buster autocross was the right decision
- Points rally #1, Seek the Right Opportunity, Bob S. reported on the rally and Jr. stated he really enjoyed it.
- The 2021 Awards banquet will be in person only, no ZOOM, and held at Smitty's on Tuesday, April 12th. All are welcome to attend. Champions from last year will be honored.
- The Bowler Midwest Musclecar Challenge has 21 entries. The event will be held no matter the number of entries.
- Our 2022 charter has been approved but we still don't have the document.
- AED update: Bob has the device and will send pictures to Dave so Dave can get parts to make it functional.
- At the autocross site the Soaring Club buffer zone has been marked and approved by the club. We should remember to delineate the zone with cones at each autocross.
- Dave L. will update COVID-19 policy and distribute to the Board for review.
- Other: We have 20 rookies so far for the 2022 Rookie season.

New business

- Patch Parties are complete except for 4-5 quick patch areas that were missed. Dave and Richard will patch them during test and tune set up. See the April Pit Stop for workers and their rewards.
- Rally #2 by Dave and Suellyn is set for Sunday, April 24th.
- Dave Lehrschall is planning the first autocross weekend, a Test and Tune on April 30th, and a point autocross on May 1st.
- Rally #3 will be put on by Harold and Karen Davis on Sunday May 15th with a length of about 80 miles.
- RRSS (Road Rally Safety Steward) update by Bob Sonntag; A RRSS inspection of a rally will get the RRSS 2 points as opposed to 5 as was written in the most recent Competition Regulations update. The wording of the Comp Regs will be updated to reflect the change. Rally Masters and Assistant Rally Masters will still get 5 points as before.
- Dave Lehrschall made a motion to allow Bridgestone RE71 Tires at SIR events this year even though they are not allowed at SCCA National events. Terry Davis seconded the motion, and the motion was passed.
- At autocross events we need to ask for volunteers to move the club trailer before and after the event.
- Jr. is going to check out a trailer at his work that we may be able to purchase and make into a new autocross timing trailer. He will get pictures for us to review.



Featured Member – Dawn Sturgeon


Dawn joined our region in July of 2016 and has been a steady participant ever since. She said she got her "need for speed" when delivering pizzas! When she saw a white Subaru WRX with pink accents at a dealership, she knew she had to have one, so she bought one.

In her maiden year in our region, 2016, she earned the Rookie of the Year award. She was also 12th in Berry points, 6th in Rally points, and 19th in autocross points. She joined



Here's some interesting information about her job:

- In 2018 I was the first female to compete in Toyota Boshoku's North America Seat Building Skills competition.
- In 2019 I was the first female to win Toyota Boshoku's North America Seat Building Skills competition, I then moved on as first female to compete in Toyota Boshoku's Global Seat Building Skills Competition in Japan.
- How did you do in Japan? "Probably mid pack. They only announced • 1st, 2nd, and 3rd didn't give results for anyone past that there were 19 competitors."
- What were the judging criteria? "Safety, Quality, and • Productivity. We were given a 30-minute time limit to complete the seat in a specific work order that we had to memorize. We were not allowed to drop any parts. All nuts and bolts had to be fastened within 2nM of specified torgue value. Had to perform all quality checks (pull check on all fasteners). Appearance no wrinkles or stress marks/whitening on plastics, no scuffs or contamination."



How many men did you beat? "6. There were only 8 competitors in the seat assembly competition, The year I won there was one other female."

Dawn and her husband Brent bought a Ford Mustang GT and are racing it in F Street. Dawn's daughter, Michelle, has joined the team and is driving a Volkswagen GTi with her dad Jason riding shotgun until she gets her license.









Did you know?

- If you are a Southern Indiana Region member and compete with us and you don't have an annual waiver you will be charged a fee for using the SpeedWaiver when registering.
- Paul usually forgets to charge the \$2 SpeedWaiver charge.
- When you complete your registration on motorsportreg.com you accept responsibility for monetary damages that depend on what you damage?
- 2005 or older Snell certified helmets are no longer acceptable for autocross. 2010 and newer are acceptable.
- The SCCA Time Trials Nationals will be held at NCM Motorsports Park in Bowling Green, KY the 12th through the 15th of May. (Thu – Sun) <u>https://timetrials.scca.com/</u> They are looking for workers! <u>kyscca@gmail.com</u>

- Year-end competition awards for autocross and rally are computed differently.
- The least number of Berry points you can earn is 1 for attending a monthly meeting. The most is 5.
- Solo Safety Steward training is being put on by the SCCA using webinars. Go to this link to sign up for the last of the scheduled sessions.

- If the pandemic stays at bay, we'll have an awards banquet on the first Friday of December.
- When you join the SCCA as a single member the rest of your family are not members. You have to sign up for a family membership and specify who they are.
- The Board members receive no reward for being your Board.
- The dues for an annual membership is \$80. \$60 of that goes to the National office.
- The dues for a family membership is \$105 and \$85 of that goes to the National office.
- Points on the website are updated when the newsletter is published.
- Each SCCA competition event has to have a sanction and insurance issued by the SCCA.
- Every person that rides in a car at an SCCA competition event has to be a member of the SCCA. There are trial memberships for passengers.
- The SCCA rulebooks are a free download on the SCCA website.

The last four controls show a 73-point difference in their scores.

The Annual Waiver Minor License will be issued to the Minor by the SCCA National Office when the following requirements are met:

 - o Terminated: waiver invalid, photo not acceptable; process must be restarted


PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP/ANNUAL WAIVER AT EVENTS

- → An Annual Waiver is valid with an active membership
- → Acceptable forms of proof of membership at events include physical or digital membership cards with 'Valid Thru' date equal to or after the event date:
 - o Physical membership card prints when membership renews (once per year)
 - Digital membership card available 24/7/365 on any mobile device
 - Retrieve on demand at your convenience; card is always current
 - Add a shortcut to your phone's home screen
