### Did you know?

- If you are a Southern Indiana Region member and compete with us and you don't have an annual waiver you will be charged a fee for using the SpeedWaiver when registering.
- Paul usually forgets to charge the \$2 SpeedWaiver charge.
- When you complete your registration on motorsportreg.com you accept responsibility for monetary damages that depend on what you damage? Here's what it says:
- At an entrant's first event of each season, the entrant will be asked to acknowledge financial responsibility for the first 50% of the \$1000 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to Rented Premises, Official Vehicles, and Third-Party Property (track property) or 50% of the \$2500 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to a Participant's Property in a Restricted Area. Damage beyond this amount is to be covered by the insurance carriers involved. The intent is to allow minor damages to be handled without the involvement of insurance claims and thus keep our sports' loss record as positive as possible.
- 2005 or older Snell certified helmets are no longer acceptable for autocross. 2010 and newer are acceptable.
- The SCCA puts out a monthly bulletin called FasTrack, and it include the latest rules updates of the club. <a href="https://www.scca.com/pages/fastrack-news">https://www.scca.com/pages/fastrack-news</a>
- Year-end competition awards for autocross and rally are computed differently.
- The least number of Berry points you can earn is 1 for attending a monthly meeting. The most is 5.
- Solo Safety Steward training has been put on by the SCCA using webinars. There are no webinars on the schedule at this time.
- If the pandemic stays at bay, we'll have an awards banquet on the first Friday of December. Reservations will be required. More information will be sent out in October and November.
- When you join the SCCA as a single member the rest of your family are not members. You have to sign up for a family membership and specify who they are.
- The Board members receive no reward for being your Board.
- The dues for an annual membership are \$80. \$60 of that goes to the National office.
- The dues for a family membership are \$105 and \$85 of that goes to the National office.
- We update points on the website when the newsletter is published.
- Each SCCA competition event has to have a sanction and insurance issued by the SCCA.
- Every person that rides in a car at an SCCA competition event has to be a member of the SCCA. There are free trial memberships for passengers at each autocross, just ask.
- The SCCA rulebooks are a free download on the SCCA website.
- The Run/Work days for the 2022 Solo Nationals have been posted. Click here to see them.

- At the Bowler event our public address system crapped out. Dave Lehrschall took the system home and did a thorough diagnosis of it. The primary problem was the cable connectors. They had broken or almost broken wires. He replaced the connectors and retested and found some issues inside the speaker he had. He fixed that and then noticed the amplifier output on one channel was poor. He talked to his brother-in-law who had some experience as a DJ and the associated electronics and got a used amplifier. It'll be installed for the next autocross.
- Cable problems make up almost all of our issues with autocross timing and scoring. When winding up the cables one shouldn't drag the cable as it is wound on the spool. Secure one end and walk toward it from the other end as you wind it up. We'll address the technique at the driver's meetings.

- The points gathering is in full swing with the three points rallys, meetings, Patch Party Workdays, The Bowler MMC workdays, and autocross #1.
- The results sheet breaks down points earned by paying events so you can keep track of your totals.

Last year's Berry points champion, Ernie Roales, is leading the points again because he has participated in every club event and has done well in rallys and autocrosses. He worked every Patch Party Day and has attended all 5 club meetings. At the first rally, Bob Sonntag's "Seek the Right Opportunity", he and Sue trailed B Class winners Jim Cannon and Carrie Moore by 19 points. At the second rally, "Fooled Again" put on by the Lehrschalls, he and navigator Sue won their class with a 90-point advantage over team Cannon/Moore. At the Harold and Karen Davis "May Day" rally they again were victorious in B Class beating Jim and Darlene Cannon by 240 points.

In the first autocross of the year, Ernie let Jim Cannon drive his car and Jim promptly went all "Uppity Boy" and beat Ernie by over a second and a half to take the class win. A couple of weeks later Ernie also worked both days of the Bowler Midwest Musclecar Challenge to garner even more Berry points. Ernie looks well on his way to another Berry point Championship.

### SIR Road Rally #3 "May Day" was it a cry for help?

Harold and Karen Davis put on "A May Day" rally. Purely to help turnout, they based their rally in the Evansville and stuck to the neighboring counties. Harold and Karen live in Terre Haute and spent several weekends camping in the Evansville to develop the rally. The weekends were invested very well. It was an excellent rally. A 10-car turnout is super for us. Three cars in our equipped "A" class. Six in our "B" class and one car in the Guest/Weekend Member class. Twenty percent of the turnout was first timers.

I sent a lot of spam about the rally for Harold had teased us with the route using something like ninety instructions for ninety miles of route, and that we would see zebras but not a zoo. A billboard? An umpire school? Cross walk references? What the...? Anyway, I spent more time thinking about dealing with ninety instructions in ninety miles. I was reasonably sure that we would not be spending the afternoon on an Interstate, so I figured there'd be at least a minute between each instruction.

The morning of the event, I was given a heads-up that the novice instruction should be sure to talk about ONTO and the Protection by Stop or Yield main road rules. I covered those topics thoroughly.

Harold touched on the zebras and even had pictures of them in the General Instructions. BLAST!! Just striped signs marking hazards at the edge of the road. Harold also mentioned that some signs would be parallel to the direction of travel. Typically, that means the signs are just a bit harder to spot. Team Davis meant "and you'd better be looking for signs IN intersections." It's too bad that maps.google.com's image does not show the intersection as it is now. Google - Google Maps

As Harold observed -- when he wasn't blaming Karen for being the devious one -- a very devious rallymaster builds the entrants' confidence through much of the rally, and then leads the over-confident entrant to the edge of the intersection (IE cliff). No push necessary. Most of us managed to tumble off the cliff without any extra nudge. Ah, the joy of a Protected 4-way intersection where the four ways use only three road names. Google - Google Maps Where was that darn Snap-On truck when we needed the extra moment to eyeball the intersection? Or would we have blasted on with a Straight as Possible (on the road to HELLo, we'll just use a TA...and mis-figure it).

As I spammed about it, all teams needed to bring their A game. It was a good afternoon, with many good checkpoint scores. Team Roales (best in B and best overall) and Team Lehrschall (best in A and second best overall) did bring their A games and thinking caps. Looking at how often those teams bought time, I think they also had brought their Sunday best shopping hats!

**Bob Sonntag** 

Suellyn and I had a great time with the Harold and Karen Davis' "A May Day" road rally. That's not to say our Driver – Navigator Team was without stress. We (translate to Driver Dave) made several significant mistakes (4) which we worked to correct by adding time allowances of 4 min 30 sec, 2 min 30 sec, 4 min 30 sec, and a whopping 12 min 30 sec for a total TA of 24 minutes! My side-by-side screen shots from our entry device and a back-up device show that our score was reduced from 1786 seconds to a class-winning 243 seconds. We could have done even better (-134 seconds for a total of 109) if we had tracked our time better and entered more appropriate time allowances.

The rally was great! Harold and Karen's review of the rally instructions was clear and complete. Harold carefully repeated, in detail, the Main Road Rule for "Protection by Stop or Yield." But, like several others, I messed it up royally. Initially, I saw that the intersection had protection by stop signs in two directions and turned right as I should have. However, I quickly spotted a Yield sign, panicked, and incorrectly diagnosed that road as "protected." I made another of many careful U-turns, entered a TA, and proceeded to follow an errant path others had also made. After a few minutes down the road, I decided that I had outsmarted myself, made another careful U-turn, returned to the intersection in question, upped my TA, and returned to the correct route. (The one I tried and discounted earlier). There was a Yield sign, but it was facing me, not the traffic coming to the intersection.

The stress entered just before the rally start. I had set-up the two phones with the Richta Competitor® app and while turning off unwanted notifications managed to kill the in-car map display. After some quick CAST calculations at the Odo check stopping point, I got the map back up a few seconds before our scheduled departure time. We started out a little stressed, especially my navigator, who loves the display of upcoming roads and intersections. I quickly messed up the second leg. On the day, Suellyn and I spent a lot of time discussing what we had missed and what we should do next. One or both of us had made a mistake, again. We stuck with it and talked about our upcoming wedding anniversary.

I either learn something new or I am reminded of a good habit each time we rally. We had gotten away from writing down the time when we execute a route instruction. If we written these down for the "A May Day" rally, my TA estimates would have been based upon real time as opposed to my feel for how much time was involved once we knew we had messed up. My suggestion is to always write down that time, so you may use the time allowance feature most effectively.

We planned on 6 or 7 cars . . . We ended up with 10. Four of which were either new to rallying or rusty. Bob did a good job doing a first timer class. Hopefully we would see them all at the finish.

After the last car started the event, we headed to the mid-rally stop in Owensville. As I'm driving Karen is watching the "Rally Show" on the Richta map feature. Listening to Karen help them get back on course was like the soundtrack from an old movie when the Air Traffic Controller is talking down the pilot that is lost in the fog. There were two intersections where we thought a few entrants may have issues. We were watching those on the Richta map rooting for the first timers to get it right. They didn't. But as it turned out they had plenty of company. Despite it all, all entrants made it to the finish point. Most stayed and had a good time waiting for the results. Thank You Bob for harvesting the results from the Richta system.

Dave and Suellyn Lehrschall did a great job recovering from their issues, taking the correct time allowance, and finishing first in class A with 243 points. Davis/Sonntag were second with 580. First timers, Noah and Dean Fehribach, were third with a very respectable 1070.

Ernie and Sue Roales took first in class B and best in the event with a 109. James and Darlene Cannon made it close with a 349. # Notes from the Director's Chair Area 4 Director Update for June 2022

May was jammed with events, Zoom meetings, etc., so I'm glad I have a bit of a breather in June. I will be going to MIS for a FSAE event there (6/15-6/17) followed by a visit to Grattan for my home region's double regional (6/18, 6/19). The FSAE event will feature electric vehicles prepared by collegiate teams from around the country. It should quite a learning experience for me. I hope to bring some valuable info across to the EVAC group.

### Video Conference Meetings:

- Club Racing Board (CRB) (5/3): With more 600cc motors in F500, the name of the class has been changed to F600. That will take effect on 1/1/13. A discussion about who is responsible for proving illegality was held. Changes to that wording may be forthcoming. More work was done on the face-to-face meeting to be held in July. The results of CRB rules changes can be seen here.
- Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (5/11): The committee received some feedback on its prototype rules package and the revision process has begun. We are also nearly finished with a package for Production cars as well as a package for formula cars. We continue to the revision process of the SCREV as well.
- ➤ Board of Directors (BoD) (5/23): I updated the Board on EVAC (see above). We continued to prepare for our face-to-face meeting in Kansas City in July. We're working on a revised document control system as well. We are also in the middle of an outside audit and all appears to be going well there.

#### SCCA Events:

- StCR @ PIRC (HST) (4/29-5/1): While warmer this year, there was still some rain over the course of the weekend. There was a lot of close racing on <u>Saturday</u>. Sunday morning's Group 1 race (T2, T3, T4, STU, STL) was marred by an incident that forced a long black flag to make repairs to an existing tire wall as well as add more tire wall to the secondary pit entrance. The PIRC staff are to be commended for their ingenuity, speed and precision while making the track safe to race on again. All the races were shortened to 30 minutes. As rain is the great equalizer, there were several close races on <u>Sunday</u> too. See all the results <u>here</u>.
- SCCA Enduro @ Nelson Ledges (NL) (5/21, 5/22): As this was the inaugural Enduro program event and it was going to be held in our backyard, I thought it imperative that I attend. I had a great time and the event great. As an F&C guy from way back, I was honored to work a corner for an hour while the "real" workers went in for their lunch break. The drivers, workers, organizers, and track all learned a great deal about how these events work. I was pleasantly surprised by the camaraderie shown between the teams. Expertise, tools and parts were lent where needed. Great cheers went up across the paddock and pit lane when a team re-entered the race after major repairs. The competition was fierce as well. After seven of the eight hours, the strategies had played out. The leaders were ahead by less than a minute and had to conserve fuel by slowing a bit. Second place was hammering hard to force first place to go quicker and use more fuel (which would require a 5 minute pit stop). Alas, Mother Nature stepped in with lightning in the area and the race had to be checkered 30 minutes early. The takeaway is that the




### <u>Autocross</u>

Here's Ernie Roales' course design for his annual "Quick and Dirty" autocross. Note that it starts from the end of the course near the terminal.






### Southern Indiana Region "Follow the S-Curve" Autocross July 10th, 2022






### June 1978 Pit Stop


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### TROPHY TALK




Other entries ranged from "Look at her independent front suspension!" (F. Pendley) to "Oh my! Spun it again!" (J. Bootz).






