



#### Did you know?

- The August club meeting, next month, will be held at the <u>Log Inn</u> in Warrenton, IN. <u>Reservations are</u> required, contact treasurer@sirscca.org with your headcount.
- How much of that autocross entry fee you pay actually ends up in the club bank account?
  - \$32.00 is charged to each SCCA member
  - o \$5.00 is paid to the airport for each car that takes to the course
  - \$ 6.50 is paid to the SCCA as a sanction fee for each car that takes to the course
  - \$ 7.50 is paid to the SCCA as an insurance fee for each car that takes to the course
  - \$ 1.82 is paid to MotorSportReg.com for each entrant
  - o \$11.18 is deposited in our bank account for each entrant
  - o A little over a third of the entry fee goes to the club.
- The 2022 Rookie season has begun, and we have 23 of them. There are 45 points available to all Rookies. 20 each in Rally and Autocross. 5 in club meetings. The Rookie that accumulates the most points between July and November will win the Rookie of the Year.
- Members that Join the club after June 30th are considered rookies in the following year.
- If you are a Southern Indiana Region member and compete with us and you don't have an annual waiver you will be charged a fee for using the SpeedWaiver when registering so don't forget to uncheck the SpeedWaiver box during registration. Paul is now remembering to charge the \$2 SpeedWaiver charge.
- From the 2022 Solo Rule Book, section 3.3.3.B.1: "In an autocross car all loose items, inside and outside the car, must be removed. Handheld items, such as but not limited to, cameras and cell phones are considered loose items." That means a passenger cannot use a camera to take videos inside a car.
- When you complete your registration on motorsportreg.com you accept responsibility for monetary damages that depend on what you damage? Here's what it says:
  - At an entrant's first event of each season, the entrant will be asked to acknowledge financial responsibility for the first 50% of the \$1000 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to Rented Premises, Official Vehicles, and Third-Party Property (track property) or 50% of the \$2500 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to a Participant's Property in a Restricted Area. Damage beyond this amount is to be covered by the insurance carriers involved. The intent is to allow minor damages to be handled without the involvement of insurance claims and thus keep our sports' loss record as positive as possible.
- The SCCA puts out a monthly bulletin called FasTrack, and it include the latest rules updates of the club. <a href="https://www.scca.com/pages/fastrack-news">https://www.scca.com/pages/fastrack-news</a>
- If the pandemic stays at bay, we'll have an awards banquet on the first Friday of December. Reservations will be required. More information will be sent out in October and November.
- When you join the SCCA as a single member the rest of your family are not members. You have to sign up for a family membership and specify who they are.
- The Board members receive no reward for being your Board. Actually, there is one reward, their banquet meal is paid for by the club.
- The dues for an annual membership are \$80. \$60 of that goes to the National office.
- The dues for a family membership are \$105 and \$85 of that goes to the National office.
- We update points on the website when the newsletter is published.
- Each SCCA competition event has to have a sanction and insurance issued by the SCCA.
- Every person that rides in a car at an SCCA competition event has to be a member of the SCCA. There are free trial memberships for passengers at each autocross, just ask.
- The SCCA <u>autocross rulebook</u> is a free download on the SCCA website.
- Use this <u>link</u> to see all the information for the 2022 Solo Nationals.
- On the bottom of page 4 of the June <u>Fastrack</u> there is an interesting proposition regarding tires for Street classes for National Solo events. You should read it and the rest of the FasTrack too.

At points autocross #3, Ernie's "Quick 'n Dirty ver. 6.26.22", Jim won the D Street class and 5 Berry points, but Ernie could only manage to get 2.

Paul Dornburg jumped up to 3<sup>rd</sup> from 5<sup>th</sup> and is only 3 points from first. Dave Lehrschall has passed over Terry Davis to get to 4<sup>th</sup> while Bob Sonntag remains 6th. Larry Pearsall is 7<sup>th</sup> ahead of Jeff Jackson 8<sup>th</sup> and Barry Beaman 9<sup>th</sup>. 10<sup>th</sup> is Dawn Sturgeon who dropped Carolyn Dornburg and Steve Backer down a couple of positions.

Jr. Crowe wheeled the "Kenzi" Cayman to third in autocross points. Graham Wink tied Jr. in autocross points but lost the position based on Jr.'s quicker single run. Fifth place went to Jim Cannon in his "borrowed" Honda. Jim keeps beating his car owner Ernie Roales who was right behind Jim in sixth. Barry Beaman was seventh just a tick behind Roales. Steve Backer, Brent Sturgeon, and Don Beaman were 8<sup>th</sup>,9<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> respectively.

After 2 events Dornburg leads the Autocross Points Championship with a perfect 2000. Jim Cannon is second just 27 points behind followed by Jon Schwartze who trails Jim by just 3. Graham Wink is fourth, 38 out of 1<sup>st</sup>, followed by Jr. Crowe, 53 points in arrears.

Ernie Roales' "Quick 'n Dirty Ver. 6.26.22" autocross lived up to its name with a course that was in places very quick and also painfully slow in other spots. After a nationals style start one negotiated a large Chicago Box before a slalom that let the driver choose which side to start on. Going left meant one had to get back to the right before the hole in the wall. Going right meant one would not have to avoid that last slalom cone and would be lined up for the hole in the wall. All that was fun but then a very acute right-hand turn had everyone hard on the brakes and down to their lowest gear for a short jaunt to an open left turn, through a 6-pack of cones and if one did it right a drift around another left to a short straight before the U-turn to the right. After the U-turn one had to negotiate the 6-pack slalom 6-pack straight. Then another hard on the brakes right hander that really tried your ability to wait. If one was too enthusiastic here the car would push out to the left and valuable time would be wasted waiting to get lined up for the last section of the course which consisted of 2 more 6-packs before a left to the finish.

Jon Schwartze was the quickest on the course with 42.8 second run. Paul Dornburg trailed Jon by a little over 2 tenths of a second with a 43.0. When runs were indexed, and summed Dornburg had won his 3<sup>rd</sup> event of the year. Schwartze was 2<sup>nd</sup> while "Uppity Boy" Jim Cannon got 3<sup>rd</sup> in Ernie's car.

# Notes from the Director's Chair Area 4 Director Update for July 2022

I thought June was going to allow me to take a breath.....but I was mistaken. Yes, I had fewer events to attend in person but there were several more Zoom meetings, EVAC emails to write, etc., so I was still pretty busy this past month.

Next month I will be driving to Kansas City for the BoD meeting on 7/29, 7/30. While there, I will also be sitting in on the CRB meeting on 7/28.

#### Video Conference Meetings:

- ➤ Club Racing Board (CRB) (6/7): Much discussion was had about a new initiative called "Green to Checker" or G2C. A myriad of decisions and policies over the years have led to poor performance on track during Club Racing events. There are just too many sessions that are stopped by a black flag all (BFA) or under full course yellow (FCY) due to an incident on track. G2C will try to change the course away from the trend of too many BFAs and FCYs which diminishes the race experience for all involved. This policy is in the planning phase and I will report the results when the protocols are adopted. While this was discussed by the CRB, rest assured this has also been discussed at the BoD level as well. Changes are coming once we figure out the most effective way to alter the course of the program. More work was done on the face-to-face meeting to be held in July (7/28). The results of CRB rules changes can be seen here.
- ➤ Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (6/8): We had guests for part of the meeting (Chris Robbins and Abby Scher) as we discussed how to train and educate the SCCA membership on how to interact with EVs when they participate at events. We tied up some loose ends on the 2<sup>nd</sup> iteration of the SCREV. We are also nearly finished with a package for Production cars and are continuing work on a package for formula cars.
- ➤ BSpec Advisory Committee (6/14): The BSAC group had some solid suggestions for how to modify our ESpec rules package.
- Touring Advisory Committee (6/20): The TAC folks had some sage advice for me on the ESpec rules as well.
- > SCCA BoD Team Development (6/22): Those of us new to the BoD were asked to take a Myers Briggs Type Indicator Test. That was done online a couple of weeks ago. The results were revealed during a two hour Zoom call. I had never done this type of personality analysis before. All of this was done to allow the BoD work better together and be a more effective governing body.
- ➤ Board of Directors (BoD) (6/27): We had a light agenda since we are meeting face to face next month. We discussed the compensation for the President (Mike Cobb). I gave an EVAC update. We did more planning for our meeting in Kansas City next month. We also received an update on the Haynes lawsuit.
- ➤ Production Advisory Committee (6/28): Once again, a sub committee of the CRB provided some valuable insight on how we should modify the ESpec rules package.

#### SCCA Events:

- FSAE @ MIS (6/15-6/17): Man oh man! What a great time I had at this event. To see so many college kids working together was truly uplifting. There were teams representing schools from all over the country as well as several more from Canada. As Chair of the EVAC, my goal was to see how the EVs were designed and built. To that end, I hung out in the EV inspection area. This allowed me to watch the inspectors go through the EV cars with a fine tooth comb. Watching them helped me understand how the EVs were wired. I was especially interested in the safety features of the EVs. We are adopting some of these key safety features in our prototype and formula car rules packages.
- ➤ WMR SCCA Double Regional @ Grattan Raceway (6/18, 6/19): This event was fun to attend as it brought me back to my roots. I started out as an F&C guy way back when and that's what I did this weekend. I had the pleasure of working with a new member too. It was another chance for me to "pay it forward" so the next generation of SCCA member gets the advice and counsel that I did when I joined.
- ➤ I have updated my calendar on the GLDiv website with events I'd like to go to this season. Click <u>here</u> to see where I'll be this summer.

Be sure and visit the <u>GLDiv website</u> for information about all of the SCCA programs within the division. We have schedules, official's contact info, standings, etc. for all the SCCA programs.




#### **Autocross**

It's been a while since I've written a column for Pit Stop. So, after being pestered a bit, I decided to give a season update.

#### Gabe Fehribach Racing

We started off the 2022 race season with the Alliance Autosport team setting up a private shakedown and personal coaching weekend in early March at Polecat Training Center in southern Tennessee for any drivers that wanted to participate. My goal was to shake off the issues we had at the Runoffs pertaining to the brakes that contributed to Gabe's inability to score a top-ten in his first outing at the national event. Upon arrival, we found that the track wasn't well-suited for an FE2--top gear was only 4th--but it provided ample opportunity to test handling, car control, and the brakes. The team had done a full rebuild of the brakes in the offseason, but in a morning session Gabe's brake pedal jammed on a steering knuckle heading into a hard left-hander, causing quite a panic for the now third-year Formula Enterprises 2 (FE2) pilot. A quick turn of the steering wheel unjammed the pedal just in time to avoid a serious mishap. Things were not looking up. The team did some grinding on a universal joint in the steering column, moved the brake pedal closer to the driver about half an inch, and bled the brakes again over lunch. The afternoon was spent with seat time, but solid speed did not appear due to lack of confidence in the brakes. We all left PTC scratching our heads about what was going on with the brakes but the rest of his Van Diemen-Mazda was working flawlessly.

Next up was the Ohio Valley Region tech day and open house at the Alliance Autosport shop. This afforded folks to come in, get an annual on their race car, get the helmet sticker for the season, see the other team cars, and meet drivers and the team personnel. Guests of ours were awestruck by the number and types of cars the Alliance Autosport team owns and manages. Cars were in different stages of maintenance, too, allowing for views of the internal



workings of purpose-built race cars like the FE2, Spec Racer Ford, and the Cope GT2 Camaro.

Shortly thereafter, tragedy struck. The team's co-owner and lead driver Scott Rettich passed away suddenly, leaving his wife Rebecca, business partner Suren, everyone in the team, extended racing family, and the national SCCA club racing family at a tremendous loss. He had just become a 7-time national champion at Indy (his 6th in FE/FE2). Gabe's season hadn't even started and his mentor and coach was gone from us. A celebration of life was held near his home in Columbus, Ohio but tears were the voice for the day. Rest in peace, Scott (1984-2022).

Gabe and his car "Amethyst" would have their first race weekend of 2022 at a Hoosier Super Tour event at Pittsburgh International Race Complex (PittRace), a track he had yet to run at. The team had done another rebuild of the brakes during car setup ahead of the weekend and Gabe would get a test for them under the intense competition of the top-tier amateur racing that Hoosier Super Tours are known for. With a day of testing under his belt and the brakes feeling confident, it was time for the fun. In an intense qualifying session, Gabe would put the car 8th of 15 in class (12th of 28 overall in the mixed classes) and head to work Saturday afternoon to move up the field. With some work in his FE2 machine, he would move up to 6th in class and 9th overall--a top 10 in a 28-car field is a very good result. It certainly felt like a win given everything going on. Sunday's race was looking like it would be a wet one. When lining up for Sunday's race, the changing conditions on the track brought about serious track damage from a shunt in the prior group that was running. Everyone in Gabe's group would get the message that at least 30 minutes would be needed for repairs, so all either returned to the paddock with their cars or got out of the car and left them on the starting grid; Gabe and his teammates chose the latter. By the time Gabe was able to head out on track, it was raining very hard. In the conditions, Gabe's visor and glasses fogged up forcing him to consider his and his fellow competitor's safety so he pulled into the pits to park the car. His weekend was over. A rather cool circumstance was afforded the weekend, however. Former Miami Dolphins defensive end Jared Odrick (1st round draft pick in 2010) was driving his Porsche 911 GT2 Cup car that weekend in a sort of shared paddock space with our team. He's a super nice guy and pretty quick in a Porsche to boot. Jared finished 3rd in GT2 on Saturday and took the win on Sunday.

The second weekend would see Gabe return to Watkins Glen for the Finger Lakes Region Hoosier Super Tour where he scored a Saturday podium in 2021. Leading up to the weekend, Gabe and I decided on a tire strategy that would have him on used tires for practice and Q1 on Friday but then strap on sticker (new) Hoosiers for Q2 to set a fast time in the forecasted cool morning temperatures. On used tires in the warm Friday afternoon heat, Gabe put his car in provisional 4th of 10 in class on the starting grid. Knowing cooler temps were coming, the team lowered the ride height, reduced the rake\*, and trimmed out the wings for faster speed. Come Saturday morning the temps were ideal for fast times. Combined with the sticker tires and trimmed out race car Gabe shaved 3.096 seconds off his Q1 time to put his car 3rd on the grid for his best qualifying position in a Super Tour. At the start of Race 1 on Saturday afternoon, a prototype car ahead of him on the grid missed the start and Gabe fell back to 4th where he ran the rest of the race in a green-to-checker 20-minute session, even finishing on the lead lap with the mega-fast Prototype 1 of Chip Romer. The warmer

temps of the afternoon did not suit the setup we had, but we knew the feature race on Sunday would again be in cool temperatures. In Sunday's feature race, he again would be held up by a car in front braking early into Turn 1 at the start dropping him to 4th, but this time he had a setup that would not disappoint. On lap one he took advantage of the tow from the prototypes and Formula Atlantics in front of him and set a blistering 141.2 mph in the speed trap in the long run to the bus stop chicane. On lap 9 and tired of being held up, he would make his pass for 3rd heading into the bus stop chicane and check out from there, building a gap of 18.1 seconds over the next five laps. He had scored his 2nd Super Tour podium and a Hoosier hat, a Hoosier towel, and a bottle of champagne to go with it.

His third weekend would be at the Ohio Valley Region's Great Lakes Race of Champions SCCA Majors at Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course, a track he knows well. Due to work commitments, he would be unable to attend the Friday practice day and would just drop right into qualifying on Saturday morning. On used Hoosier tires from the Runoffs, Gabe would put the car 4th on the FE2 grid (10th overall), just 0.559 seconds off his teammate Amy Hollowell in 3rd who had been able to practice Friday. The race on Saturday afternoon would go green-to-checker for 25 minutes and Gabe would finish where he started but 9.462 seconds adrift of Amy in 3rd. Amy is one tough racer. Sunday morning with the refresher laps from Saturday's events under his belt, he would qualify 3rd in FE2 (and 6th overall) for Sunday's feature race. With rain once again making a threat, the team prepared the wet tires but left them set aside, just in case. Sunday morning saw the Spec Racer Ford group pay an homage to Scott Rettich with a missing man formation lap, the pole position left open for the champ with a 2-time SRF champ alongside in the front row with him. What a fantastic tribute. Sunday's FE2 race after lunch would see clearing skies, but not a green flag throughout. Again, Gabe had a prototype ahead of him miss the start and he dropped to 5th in FE2 by turn 1 as other cars swarmed him and the prototype. Gabe set about getting 3rd back so he put pressure on 4th place, eventually passing him after a few laps going

into the hard right-hander Turn 4 at the end of the back straight. Next in his sights: Amy in 3rd. He kept his front wing right on her gearbox for a few laps as he assessed his options when an opportunity arose. Exiting the Turn 2 keyhole, Amy in 3rd approached a back marker prototype 2 at the Turn 3 kink in the back straight. Gabe used the tow from both cars in order to slingshot and as Amy made her move to go around the prototype, Gabe made his move for 3rd by late braking into Turn 4. Gabe would start pulling away, but a full course yellow was thrown a

few laps later for a competitor disabled in the keyhole. The race would finish under yellow, and another Majors podium achievement unlocked. Gabe's times really were blisteringly fast all weekend, though. His fastest lap in the Sunday race was an awesome 1:28.461, but not his fastest lap of the

weekend. To put that in some perspective, Jared Odrick in his Porsche clocked a fast lap of 1:35.367, just about 7 seconds slower. The first and second place FE2's were the current and the former lap record holders at Mid-Ohio--a tough couple of racers to beat.

His next outing will be the South Bend Region and Detroit Region's joint "The BERT Sprints" Majors at Gingerman Raceway in western Michigan.

\*Rake is where the front of the car is lower than the rear. When done properly, rake in a race car creates a low air pressure zone underneath the car, which in turn creates downforce.

#### **General Instructions:**

#### **Instructions in Order of Precedence:**

- 1) Follow special instructions.
- 2) Follow route instructions (RI).
- 3) Follow main road rules (MRR) in order listed.

#### **Special Instructions:**

- 1) Drive safely!
- 2) Assume you have completed your odometer check.
  - Your odo check distance measured 14.5 miles.
  - The Rally Master's distance measured 14.1 miles.
- 3) Rally City's distances between intersection centers were measured using the Rally Master's odometer.
- 4) At the end of your rally report:
  - a. Distance traveled using your odometer.
  - b. Distance traveled using the rally master's odometer.
  - c. The time required to complete this short leg of the rally using a CAST of 30.

#### Main Road Rules:

- 1) Straight as Possible (The main road is the road that causes the least variation in the direction of travel).
- 2) Right at T (The main road goes to the right at all "T" and "Y" intersections. Therefore, "T" and "Y" intersections have only left opportunities on this rally). All roads are public. All roads are paved. Posted dead ends, posted no outlets, and visible dead ends do not exist as opportunities.

RI 01 Begin the rally at the intersection of Apple Avenue and 47th Street heading east. CAST 30

RI 02 Left at 1st Opp (48th Street)

RI 03 Right Onto 46th Street


Check Point 1 at intersection of 46th Street and Cherry Ave.

RI 04 Begin Free Zone at Cherry Street

RI 05 Calculate distances traveled and the Rally Master's expected rally leg time at a CAST of 30 mph.


# Rally City




We also had a good size guest entry. The guests were very competitive as witnessed by the scores of the first several places. Hopefully we will see these people in future events.

and the Tri-State area.



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

### MINOR ANNUAL WAIVERS

A minor taking part in an SCCA event as a competitor, on track participant, or volunteer or worker with access to restricted (hot) areas must have an **Annual Minor Waiver** on file for the calendar year. Age of Majority is 18 years except in AL and NE at 19; MS at 21.

The Annual Waiver Minor License will be issued to the Minor by the SCCA National Office when the following requirements are met:





Come to our events and bring a friend. Drag them if you have to. We welcome everyone! Guess who we'll have an article about next month?



Roundabout: Banana & 47<sup>th</sup> to Grape & 49<sup>th</sup> = 1.6 Grape & 49<sup>th</sup> to Banana & 47<sup>th</sup> = 0.6

RI 02 Left at 1<sup>st</sup> Opp (Left at 48<sup>th</sup> Street. Orange Avenue is a dead end – not an opp). RI 03 Right Onto 46<sup>th</sup> Street (Until coming to 46<sup>th</sup> Street, Continue Straight as Possible to "T" at Cherry Avenue, go Right, Continue Straight as Possible to "T" at 50th Street, go Right, Straight as Possible takes you around the corner at Apple Avenue, Continue Straight as Possible to 46<sup>th</sup> Street, Turn Onto 46<sup>th</sup> Street.

Check Point and RI 04 Begin Free Zone at Cherry Street.
