

Did you know? By Paul

- There are no results in this issue because we did not have any competition events since the last issue.
- The August club meeting will be held at the <u>Log Inn</u> in Warrenton, IN. <u>Reservations are required</u>, contact treasurer@sirscca.org with your headcount.
- When registering for an event on MSR, don't forget to uncheck to SpeedWaiver box if you have an annual waiver. Especially if you're registering for someone else unless they don't have an annual waiver. Got that?
- The "Punch Line" rally had to be postponed because of a clerical error. It was discovered that Sunday morning that there was no SCCA sanction or insurance in place. It is rescheduled for October 16th.
- At the last autocross (AX4) each of the 4 heats took exactly 35 minutes to complete.
- Did you notice that at AX4 every driver but 2 got a lower score than their last event? Cooper Wink and Morgan Metz both improved, not counting Dornburg of course.
- The 2022 Rookie season has begun, and we have 23 of them. There are 45 points available to all Rookies. 20 each in Rally and Autocross. 5 in club meetings. The Rookie that accumulates the most points between July and November will win the Rookie of the Year.
- Members that Join the club after June 30th are considered rookies in the following year.
- If you are a Southern Indiana Region member and compete with us and you don't have an annual waiver you
 will be charged a fee for using the SpeedWaiver when registering so don't forget to uncheck the SpeedWaiver
 box during registration. Paul is now remembering to charge the \$2 SpeedWaiver charge.
- From the 2022 Solo Rule Book, section 3.3.3.B.1: "In an autocross car all loose items, inside and outside the car, must be removed. Handheld items, such as but not limited to, cameras and cell phones are considered loose items." That means a passenger cannot use a camera to take videos inside a car.
- When you complete your registration on motorsportreg.com you accept responsibility for monetary damages that depend on what you damage? Here's what it says:
 - At an entrant's first event of each season, the entrant will be asked to acknowledge financial responsibility for the first 50% of the \$1000 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to Rented Premises, Official Vehicles, and Third-Party Property (track property) or 50% of the \$2500 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to a Participant's Property in a Restricted Area. Damage beyond this amount is to be covered by the insurance carriers involved. The intent is to allow minor damages to be handled without the involvement of insurance claims and thus keep our sports' loss record as positive as possible.
- The SCCA puts out a monthly bulletin called FasTrack, and it include the latest rules updates of the club. https://www.scca.com/pages/fastrack-news
- If the pandemic stays at bay, we'll have an awards banquet on the first Friday of December. Reservations will be required. More information will be sent out in October and November.
- When you join the SCCA as a single member the rest of your family are not members. You have to sign up for a family membership and specify who they are.
- The Board members receive no reward for being your Board. Actually, there is one reward, their banquet meal is paid for by the club.
- The dues for an annual membership are \$80. \$60 of that goes to the National office.
- The dues for a family membership are \$105 and \$85 of that goes to the National office.
- We update points on the website when the newsletter is published.
- Each SCCA competition event has to have a sanction and insurance issued by the SCCA.
- Every person that rides in a car at an SCCA competition event has to be a member of the SCCA. There are free trial memberships for passengers at each autocross, just ask.
- The SCCA <u>autocross rulebook</u> is a free download on the SCCA website.
- Use this <u>link</u> to see all the information for the 2022 Solo Nationals.
- Who has the best Disco music in the Midwest? Funky's does. See page 23 of last month's old Pit Stop.
- How did you do on the Rally quiz in last month's Pit Stop? I only heard from 2 people.
- Next year is the 50th Solo Nationals. Who wants to go? I'll organize things.
- You should ask to see the insurance/sanction sheet at every competition event.

Dornburg was so quick that only 2 of the 34 other drivers had a higher autocross points score than their last event score. In autocross points the Winks, Cooper and Graham, were 2nd and 3rd respectively. Jr. Crowe and Richard Grave were 4th and 5th. Rounding out the top 10 were course designer Jon Schwartze, John McCarthy, Brent Sturgeon, Barry Beaman and Jeff Jackson.

The next autocross, "YEE HAW!", on August 21st looks like "a slalom till you puke" course.

Video Conference Meetings:

- ➤ Club Racing Board (CRB) (7/5): We discussed roll cage rules after the severe impact that a Spec Miata incurred at Road America. On one hand the cage did its job but on the other, the driver was seriously injured. The T1 Town Hall Zoom meeting was discussed. We reviewed the Runoffs Tech Inspection lists. More work was done on the face-to-face meeting to be held in July (7/28). I updated the CRB on the work the EVAC has been doing. The results of CRB rules changes can be seen here.
- ➤ Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (7/13): With the revised SCREV sent on its way to the various program boards and their BoB liaisons, we concentrated on preparing the Club Racing rules packages. Gabe Fehribach Racing

The weekend of July 22-24 would see SIR member Gabe Fehribach return to Gingerman Raceway near South Haven, MI for his second visit. In 2021, on his first trip there without any practice, he dropped straight into qualifying and scored a podium in the Saturday race. The Sunday feature race saw him finish fourth. Given his success there last year, he was looking forward to this year's visit. The weather forecast, however, was going to threaten the weekend's activities.

The sunny test and practice day on Friday would see him score a lap just 0.010 seconds off the track record while



using a set of old tires. Things were looking up! On Saturday morning he would strap on a new set of Hoosier racing slicks and try to score his first ever pole position in an SCCA event and scoring it in a Majors would be an even bigger plus. Unbeknownst to all of us, a problem lurked. While qualifying, he couldn't get the car balance right, even radioing in that the car was undriveable. Something had happened between Friday and Saturday. Well, during the session the team called him into the pits to check tire pressures and found they were seven pounds over pressurized. After dropping those extra psi, he would only get one flying lap in before the end of the session. It would be his fastest of the day but nowhere near as fast as Friday's times. He would start Saturday's race second in class and fifth overall. Apparently, there was a miscommunication between the engineer and the technician on tire pressures. All three team FE2's had been over inflated for the session.

Saturday's race would see him start on class pole position after all when the actual pole sitter experienced a failed fuel pump. Starting fourth overall, he jumped up to third by the end of lap one. A few laps into the race, he would get passed by a faster Formula Atlantic that had started in the back due to issues in qualifying. After making the overtake, the competitor's engine let go on the next lap and spewed oil all over the track and Gabe's car. Gabe's car lost traction in the corner in the unavoidable oil slick and he went sliding off track into the grass. He would be able to keep the car moving and return to the track in 2nd place in class, losing the FE2 lead. He would go on to finish second in class and 4th overall, his first win slipping through his grasp. Still, this was his best finish to date in an SCCA Majors event.

Saturday night had heavy rain that continued into Sunday morning. Gabe opted not to partake in the Sunday qualification session knowing the rules stated his fastest lap from the two Saturday events would stand as long as no one set a faster time in Sunday qualifying. Only one competitor made the attempt in the rainy session, setting times way off Saturday's best. Thus, Gabe would again start

second in class and fifth overall. Come time for the 21 lap Sunday feature race, the track was dry, and the weather was cooperating but there was a pretty stiff wind. At the start, his plan was not to fall victim as he had in other races this season. Upon hearing "Green! Green! Green!" from his engineer in his earpiece, he sent the car flying up the inside towards Turn 1, emerging first in class and third overall. By the end of the lap, he was still in the FE2 lead and in second overall. He would fall to 3rd overall in the ensuing laps when a faster Formula Atlantic he got by on lap one got the

position back. Through the early laps, his right-front brake would keep locking up going into corners. To reduce the strain on it, he would adjust his brake bias in the cockpit towards the rear tires which created front to rear brake imbalance but that couldn't be helped if he was going to keep the tire competitive. In the ensuing laps he would open up a 14 second gap to second by the penultimate lap. After passing the start/finish line where the white flag was waved signifying the final lap, a couple of back markers




would slow his pace and he would cross the line 10 seconds ahead of the next FE2. He was now an SCCA Majors winner and was smiling all the way home.

Next up: The Ohio Valley Region's October regional event where he gets back into a Spec Racer Ford for the weekend.

Pit Stop should and does promote the image of a well run, active region, of which we are all proud. I hope you also think its a good move.

SIR, thanks to our local government, has saved bundles of money in the past because of free lots to run on. Other clubs have not been this lucky our luck could change some day. Trophy costs are going up each year, dash plaques have increased 30% in cost this year, the trailer will need work by this fall, we could use more pylons, and we need to look into insurance for the equipment again. In the mean time you can all help forestall any increases by your attendence and financial support of the few people in the club willing to work their cans off to supplement the income from dues and entry fees to keep the cash flow respectable.

Think about it -- soap box closed.


The sun was out now and the first visible emotions began to show as some-one announced its appearance. There


The atmosphere at this year's event was, to-me, something special. SIR people made it that way.



On July 23, the Indianpolis Region hosted round three of the Valvoline Interserie State Autocross Championship. The event was held at the Indiana State University Driver Education Center in Terre Haute, on the Vigo County Fairgrounds, in conjunction with the Vigo County Fair.

There were 86 entried with competitors coming from Indy Region/SCCA,
Columbus Sports Car Club, Indy Motor
Sports Club, Gateway Autocross Ass'n,
and SIR/SCCA. SIR was represented with
15 entries. Our friends from the Gateway club in St. Louis were out in large
numbers, and it was nice to see Messrs.
Flier, Roeder, Sullivan, the Haddons,
and the rest of their group so soon
after the Freedom Festival.

The course size and site were similar to the events at Washinton Square or Owensboro. However, similarity ended there as timing was done with stopwatches and the finish was a box-stop, or garage. A DNF resulted if any of the pylons were touched at the finish.

The event had been advertised as being conducted according to SCCA rules, i.e., stock cars run stock classes, and cars with any modifications run prepared or modified classes. Some entrants were either ignorant of this or just plain chose to ignore it. Needless to say, many people were upset by the classifications. All I can say is that the rules were stated far enough is advance so that everyone should have been aware of them.

A few observations on the event:

 Indy/SCCA did a good job of handling the 86 entries, with each getting 3 runs on the course.

 It might help to have a tech "line" instead of hunting the inspector in the pits to get him to tech your car.

3. A P.A. system, bullhorn, of somebody walking through the pits would help entrants stage on time. It was "by guess and by gosh" to determine what

class was running.

4. I hope Indy/SCCA can afford to sink some money into its autocross program. With an entry of 86 cars at \$6 each the region probably made a profit, considering their expenses. A new timing system would enable them to eliminate the box-stops which are dangerous. How long will it be before a stopwatch operator is injured? FRED PENDLEY

Regardless of your experience or background, if you are an automotive enthusiast there is a place for you in the SCCA. The avenues available range from amateur or professional road race driver to weekend rally or autocross driver to race worker or official. In order to successfully sanction and conduct a comprehensive autocross/rally/road racing program many experts in timing and scoring, communications, safety inspection, medical, flagging, course/race control and other skills are needed. Schools are held to train the drivers and workers and various degrees of licenses are awarded based on knowledge, ability, and experience.
