

Daniel earned the bulk of his points at our autocross events. He attended all but the first event in his Mustang and ended up 16th in autocross points in his first year. He competes in F Street a class that is deep in local talent. The least number of cars was 4 at any event. He started to show good improvement at event 6 where he was 3rd in the class of 6. In the last event he was 2nd of 4, his best class finish. We hope he comes back next year so he can pass the trophy on to the 2023 Rookie of the Year.

- How to join the SCCA? Go to my.scca.com. In big blue letters it says Join SCCA! Click and follow the prompts. On the main SCCA page, scca.com, there's a link to my.scca.com
- Annual waiver renewal begins December 2nd. Here are the instructions for you and anyone else. https://tinyurl.com/AnnualWaiver Anyone can get an annual waiver, even non-club members.
- Car classification for SCCA autocrosses can be difficult for new autocrossers. The <u>rule book</u> is a daunting read. The easiest way to determine your class is to pick up the phone and call Paul Dornburg, or Dave Lehrschall, or Jr. Crow. Their phone numbers are usually on page 2 of this newsletter. They will walk you through a series of questions that usually begin with, "Have you changed anything on your car?"
- The usage fee for the autocross pad at NCM Motorsports Park in Bowling Green is \$2,000 a day. The cost for us using the site at Lawrenceville Airport is \$5.00 per car per day, not counting the springtime repairs.
- We have been told the cost for an SCCA sanctioned event, a rally or an autocross for us, is going to go up in 2023. The Board has not discussed raising entries fees for next year.
- The SCCA puts out a monthly bulletin called FasTrack, and it includes the latest rules updates of the club. https://www.scca.com/pages/fastrack-news
- Next year is the 50th Solo Nationals. Who wants to go? I'll organize things.
- If you are a new member and want to know about SCCA programs you can start at our website, sirscca.org, or the SCCA.com website. There are links to all the programs and explanations of them. Just poke around.




Board Advisor: George Groenert,











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502-684-3491 (EVE.) OWENSBORO, KY the Great Pumpkin Rally



SIR RACING WRAP-UP





Tullius, Pickett Top TRANS-AM

DENVER--When the last car had turned its final lap on the Ricardo Rodriguez Autodrome in Mexico City, the roar of racing engines heard for the last time and the memory of battles won and lost carried home, Bob Tullius and Greg Pickett were crowned Sports Car Club of America Trans-Am Championship Series category winners and Chevrolet and Jaguar the marques with the most in 1978.

That, in a nutshell, is the year that was in Trans-Am '78.

The record books will show Tullius winning the last seven Category I races in his British Leyland-Quaker State Group 44, Inc. Jaguar XJS, tying a series record set by Mark Donohue between May 12, 1968 and August 4, 1968. Pickett's heady success in the Pickett Racing Corvette 427, winning three of the last four Trans-Ams and finishing second in Mexico to clinch the title at the very last moment, ended two years of Porsche dominance as the American marque was clearly the class of the field in '78.
