Did you know? By Paul

- The Log Inn Club meeting was well attended although it was a bit cramped on what was a very busy night at the Inn.
- The Board proposes the annual dues, and the membership approves them at the September membership meeting. You'd better be there to say yay or nay to the proposed amount.
- When registering for an event on MSR, don't forget to uncheck to SpeedWaiver box if you have an annual waiver. Especially if you're registering for someone else unless they don't have an annual waiver. Got that?
- The "Punch Line" rally had to be postponed because of a clerical error. It was discovered that Sunday morning that there was no SCCA sanction or insurance in place. It is rescheduled for October 16th.
- The 2022 Rookie season is in full swing. 4 rookies have made it to events. There are 45 points available to all Rookies. 20 each in Rally and Autocross. 5 in club meetings. The Rookie that accumulates the most points between July and November will win the Rookie of the Year.
- Members that join the club after June 30th are considered rookies in the following year.
- If you are a Southern Indiana Region member and compete with us and you don't have an annual waiver you will be charged a fee for using the SpeedWaiver when registering so don't forget to uncheck the SpeedWaiver box during registration. Paul is now remembering to charge the \$2 SpeedWaiver charge.
- From the 2022 Solo Rule Book, section 3.3.3.B.1: "In an autocross car all loose items, inside and outside the car, must be removed. Handheld items, such as but not limited to, cameras and cell phones are considered loose items." That means a passenger cannot use a camera to take videos inside a car.
- When you complete your registration on motorsportreg.com you accept responsibility for monetary damages that depend on what you damage. Here's what it says:
 - At an entrant's first event of each season, the entrant will be asked to acknowledge financial responsibility for the first 50% of the \$1000 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to Rented Premises, Official Vehicles, and Third-Party Property (track property) or 50% of the \$2500 deductible in the event of Physical Damage to a Participant's Property in a Restricted Area. Damage beyond this amount is to be covered by the insurance carriers involved. The intent is to allow minor damages to be handled without the involvement of insurance claims and thus keep our sports' loss record as positive as possible.
- The SCCA puts out a monthly bulletin called FasTrack, and it include the latest rules updates of the club. https://www.scca.com/pages/fastrack-news
- If the pandemic stays at bay, we'll have an awards banquet on the first Friday of December. Reservations will be required. More information will be sent out in October and November.
- When you join the SCCA as a single member the rest of your family are not members. You have to sign up for a family membership and specify who they are.
- The Board members receive no reward for being your Board. Actually, there is one reward, their banquet meal is paid for by the club.
- We update points on the website when the newsletter is published.
- Each SCCA competition event has to have a sanction and insurance issued by the SCCA.
- Every person that rides in a car at an SCCA competition event has to be a member of the SCCA. There are free trial memberships for passengers at each autocross, just ask.
- The SCCA autocross rulebook is a free download on the SCCA website.
- Use this link to see all the information for the 2022 Solo Nationals.
- Next year is the 50th Solo Nationals. Who wants to go? I'll organize things.
- In 1978 the area code for the entire state of Kentucky was 502.
- You should ask to see the insurance/sanction sheet at every competition event.
- When the "Punch Line" rally was moved to October the entry list was retained. If you entered and you can't make it, cancel your entry.
- Did you notice the links in the Area 4 reports didn't work? They're fixed.
- You can renew your annual membership on-line starting December 2nd, not October as previously reported.
- We've had fun runs at the end of the last few autocrosses. Try one!

I was pleased with how my "YEE HAW" autocross was received. I thought we'd have lap times in the mid 40 second range but 28 of the 30 drivers were less than 45 seconds. 4 drivers got into the 39s, 1 got a 38 and I had a 37 second run.

A section of the north side of the course has broken up badly. Dave suggested the route and I took his suggestion and rerouted my course over a grating next to the bad area. It turned out to be a good option. The Board we be discussing repair options for that section of the course.

Looking at the autocross points results I see that some people had their best points score so far this year. Looking at the 12 people that have been to every autocross, 5 scored their best points, while 7 scored lower than their best.

I like to study the autocross results sheets to see who is improving or declining. It's the time of the year where tires have been heat cycled so many times that they are hard to get up to temperature especially as we head into fall. Jr. Crowe has shown good consistency in each event. His low score (960) was at the first event. Since then, he has scored 987, 986, 973, & 988. Jon Schwartze, running on Hoosier A7s started with a 979, then a 991 and had 997 at autocross 3, his highest score so far. Then he had 955 and 955 at the next 2 events. I used to see the same pattern when I ran A7s. By the 3rd event they were at their best and then results would taper off. Only a very hot day would help get them up to temperature and then they might get too hot and roll the rubber off. I could tell by the grain pattern on the tread when that was happening. This would be the time of the year when we would be on new tires, so they'd have a heat cycle in them before the Solo Nationals and their performance would be at its best in Lincoln.

p.s. I hit 5 cones on this course and that was equal to all the cones I have hit so far this year.

Notes from the Director's Chair Area 4 Director Update for September 2022

September will be a busy month for me as I head to Lincoln, NE for the <u>Solo Nationals</u>. I'll be at that event from 9/5 to 9/10. I've never been to the Solo Nationals and am really looking forward to it. Later in the month, I'm headed to Virginia for the <u>Runoffs</u>. The Runoffs will be held at Virginia International Raceway (VIR) this year (and next) and I'll be there from 9/23 to 10/3. I've been to VIR several times. It's a fabulous facility that will really test the mettle of the competitors. As I have a brother who lives near there (Durham, NC), I get to pull double duty and visit with him. Another bonus.... staying at his place will save me (and the Club) a lot of money.

Since I'll be on the road most of the month, I may not be able to write an update for October. Hopefully, it'll be a much easier month. I am scheduled to get my left hip replaced on 10/13 (not a Friday) so I'll be able to walk, golf, bike, flag, etc. with MUCH less pain. Wish me luck....

Video Conference Meetings:

- Club Racing Board (CRB) (8/2): As we just had a face-to-face meeting in KC on 7/28, this Zoom call was more procedural in nature. We reviewed the letter log and continued the conversation on the G2C initiative (Green to Checker). I updated the CRB on the work the EVAC has been doing. The results of CRB rules changes can be seen <u>here</u>.
- Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (8/10): The revised SCREV is being reviewed by the Experiential programs (Time Trials, Track Night in America, Solo, Rally Cross). While this review is happening, we are working on a variety of things in the background. The Broch Evans Motorsports EV race car (previously a Formula Mazda) will be entered in A Mod at the Solo Nationals. The car will also be at the Runoffs but only as a static display. It will be exciting to get this car in front of SCCA folks so they can see it for themselves. We are also working on training materials for members, so they know how to interact with an EV that has entered an SCCA event. More on that to come later.
- EVAC (8/23): This was a secondary meeting among some of the EVAC to discuss data acquisition systems for the EVs in Club Racing. We met with the folks from Aim as we are considering mandating such systems in all of the EVs in Club Racing. This would make it easier to monitor voltage, power, current, etc. in these cars. Its early in the process and we wanted to make sure we had a handle on it.

SCCA Events:

CRB (7/28): As one of the liaisons to the CRB, I attended their meeting in KC. Many topics were discussed with an emphasis on long term, strategic thinking about the Club Racing program as a whole. Data acquisition to monitor performance was highlighted as this will become even more important as we move forward. Green to Checker (G2C) was discussed at length. How do we as a group (drivers, steward, workers, etc.) pull together to make sure we have more green flag laps? A variety of options were mentioned as a part of the solution. Some routine housekeeping was done as well. They updated language on officials, discussed burden of proof in compliance issues, talked about the future of T1 and how do we fold FIA

GT4 cars into Club Racing. I updated them on how the EVAC was coming along on our rules packages. This progressed into a broader discussion about EVs in Club Racing.

- BoD (7/30): Like all face to face, BoD meetings, we were updated by all the managers so we could get an assessment of each program. All the programs had bright spots and challenges. This is nothing new. The good news is that the bright spots outweighed the challenges, and I am optimistic about the Club's future. The national staff is working hard to make events better, help make the regions put on better events and make a member's experience better. We also got a review of the financial standing of the club (pretty good considering the high cost of travel these days). We were told by the marketing folks that we are "refreshing" our logos and graphic standards. As this hasn't been done in quite a while, it's probably overdue. We were also told that we are trending upward in terms of full time members.....that's always good news.
- WMR Major (8/20, 8/21): I signed up for this event so I could help out my home region (WMR) while enjoying some fun at Grattan Raceway. Once again, rain followed me to a racecourse. Saturday's schedule was marred by a session being red flagged just as the heavens unleashed a torrent on the track. With lightning in the area, the Chief Steward had no choice but to stop the clock and allow the workers to seek shelter as the storm passed through. 20 minutes later, the skies were clear, and we could go racing again. The day continued with the usual awesome, all attendee dinner. Maybe I'm jaundiced but I will stack up the dinner menu at WMR events against ANY other track food option. Sunday's races were held under nicer weather conditions. As it was the last Major east of the Mississippi, this was the last chance for drivers to qualify for the Runoffs via the Majors path.





Picnic Powwow






Phashion Photos?





CAR WARS


Long ago and far away, in a distant parking lot, a small band of drivers joined together to battle the evil forces of Asphalt!

"Timing truck too close to timing line"..."Drinking water and air supply much appreciated -- times were posted the fastest I've ever seen" ... "Really enjoyed the course-fast, but safe and difficult" ... "Is there a club to join?"... "Course should be more demanding" ... "event was well organized and cars were run and staged in a quick, efficient, and safe manner. Liked the PA system and air compressor" ... "I'll be back next year. I have been competing in events from Ohio to Texas and this was one of the best of them. SIR members were extremely helpful" ... "Need restroom facilities" ... "FTD trophy was very desirable" ... "Poor safety control. One car threw tread and was allowed to complete course".

Three other comments appeared several times throughout the replies, and as a result of their repetition, I feel it best that we answer our guests and explain SIR's policies a little better. COMMENT No. 1: "Class breakdown didn't seem fair and the number of cars required to compose a class seemed inconsistant."

Apparently we didn't explain our class breakdown rules too well. As stated in the flyer, and all articles on 26

the Freedom Festival Autocross, SIR was classifying cars according to SCCA Solo II classes with four cars required to make a class. In the event that there were less than four cars in a class, classes would be combined according to the SCCA Solo II bump order. What we failed to mention was that the top class, D/Modified or D/Mod and the lower class or classes bumped into it, would require only two cars to make a class. We have been using this to ensure that all bumping is "up" between classes instead of "down".

It seems that some confusion existed around SIR's apparently unique "guest class". "Guest" class is a misnomer; "Novice" class would be more appropriate. SIR allows new-comers to the sport to compete against other new-comers at no more than 3 events before they have to start running against SIR's members. We try to be alert and keep people out of guest class who don't belong there, but sometimes we slip.

COMMENT No. 2: "Some classes seemed to get more trophies than others."

This was true. As was announced in the flyer and all published material, trophies were awarded in quantities as listed in the SCCA Solo II rule book:

number of trophies regardless of class size and some go deeper in classes with trophies than we do. We try to award nice trophies to those who have earned 27

them and remain within our budget. <u>COMMENT No. 3</u>: "Tech inspection seemed lax, safety inspection was not thorough enough and some cars were in the wrong class."

This seems to be a recourring problem wherever you go, so whenever someone comes up with the solution to this. I'll personally nominate him or her for the "Wisdom of Solomon" award. SIR realizes these problems exist, but we like to believe all cf our guests are honest. Our tech inspectors' prime concern is safety (maybe we should institute a braking test) and therefore members and guests are allowed to classify themselves. Under SCCA Solo II rules, tech inspectors can only "suggest" a class; if a competitor elects to enter another class, then it becomes the class entrants' responsibility to police him. SIR's tech inspectors try to keep an eye out for this and "enlighten" the entrant who is hedging on the rules. We think our tech inspectors do a good job, but there's always room for improvement.

We appreciate all of you who took the time to reply to our questionaire. We enjoy having you compete with us and from your answers, we hope we can make your next trip to SIR/SCCA even better. Fred Pendley
