

## **August RE Report**

I must report on this past weekend's Southern Indiana Region of the SCCA road rally. I have to do this because I saw some great examples of focus and applied skills during our fourth championship points event, the G P Guess rally. I like to look beyond the event results to try and find little "gems" hidden in the data. This last event covered a little more than 65 miles with 8 timed rally legs. Each leg had been set up and measured to the nearest hundredth of a kilometer or 6 thousandths of a mile combined specific average speeds to achieve leg times to the nearest second. The winners of this event in our A or unlimited equipment class finished with a total error or score of 31 seconds! That's amazing when you think about driving an unpracticed route defined by a combination of standard rules and specific turn instructions over public roadways while managing your average speed to a target through starts and stops. In this case with an average error of one half second per mile traveled!

Our B or limited equipment class likes to refer to driving by the "seat of their pants". They also like to brag when they beat their A-class competition. This happens more often than we A-class competitors like to admit. The winners in B-class finished with a total score of 81 seconds! An error rate of just over one second per mile driven.

A road rally is a team event. The drivers depend on their navigators to read, interpret, and communicate the rally route instructions. In addition, recording times and distances while calculating current speed are typical navigator tasks. Traditionally, a combination of stopwatches, rally calculators, and various types of odometers/speedometers have been used. Today GPS and phone apps have been added to the mix.

For safety we discourage driving above the speed limit to make up for lost time. We use a Time Allowance strategy to "buy time" (for free) to compensate for unexpected delays. Our rallies typically use a phone app which includes a "TA" feature. If delayed by a train, signal light, or missed route instruction, the team enters their delay time, and their time to the checkpoint is adjusted. This much sounds easier than it is. The team needs to understand where they are relative to their targeted speed and calculate how much time to enter for their Time Adjustment. All of this can happen under the pressure of knowing you are rapidly adding to your late to checkpoint time. I admit that I have made big errors in my TA adjustments and need to get much better at this.

As I reviewed last weekend's results, I was impressed with the A-class win and all scores. A-class was won with an outstanding score of 31! The father / daughter team of Kurt and Lucy Schnippel have competed in our rallies before and do very well. Not only did they navigate and drive extremely well with time to target variance running between 2 and 7 seconds, but they also used their understanding of how they were running to use the TA option to fine tune their results. They reduced their score by 7 seconds with a 15 second TA going from a +11 to a -4 on the second leg. They reduced their sixth leg score by 1 second with another 15 second TA moving them from +8 to -7. Their TA use reduced their total score by 8 seconds. A relatively small adjustment. Did I mention that Terry Davis and Bob Sonntag came in second, only 8 seconds behind Kurt and Lucy? Terry and Bob had a starting hiccup and then finished the last six of eight legs with variation running with two zero's, three one's, and a two. Scoring a total of 5 over the last six legs. Outstanding! A TA entry just one notch too high, cost Terry and Bob 15 seconds and a potential winning score of 24. Not to be outdone, Paul Dornburg and Kyle Knot missed a couple of TA adjustments that cost them 100 points and a finish of 23. Harold and Karen Davis missed a TA adjustment that cost them 90 points and a potential score of 41. I've had the same experience multiple times. After each rally, I've pledged to take an extra minute or so in future rallies to understand how much error. calculation, and speed recovery time I needed to include in my TA adjustment. These results show how important is to take that extra minute to determine how much TA to enter. Greg and Theresa Wilkins finished in third place in B-class. On Sunday Greg commented that he had hurried and entered only half the TA he should have. An adjusted TA on leg 2 could have reduced their score to a 95 and a second-place trophy. A-class scores ran from 31 to 131 this past weekend. All four teams drove extremely well. All were literally just a (TA) touch away from winning. Dave Lehrschall

## Notes from the Director's Chair Area 4 Director Update for August 2024

Wow...lots of miles since the last report. Melinda and I vacationed in Oregon for a couple of weeks (I drove from the June Sprints, she flew) and I drove out to a BoD meeting in KC.

So, here's what I did since my last report.....

#### Video Conference Meetings:

- Club Racing Board (CRB) (6/4): The CRB has been working n a plan to make some major changes in the Club Racing program. Some of these changes would be announced on 6/13 during a webinar hosted by Eric Prill. The group would use the monthly meeting to polish the update. The group also reviewed some letters. The results of all of the CRB rules changes can be seen <a href="here">here</a>.
- Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (6/12): We discussed having a dedicated page on the SCCA website and what it might contain. We also chatted about the 2025 Solo rules package. We continue to work on a "Fact Sheet" for regions and venues to use when investigating EV participation. We also discussed several letters (and a new one) that came to us via the CRB letter portal.
- ➢ Board of Directors (BoD) (6/17): I had a prior commitment and was unable to attend. The minutes reflect that the group ran through the usual reports (financial, "members behaving badly", etc.). They also worked on the agenda for the face-to-face meeting to be held in late July.
- CRB (7/2): I did not attend as I was on vacation. The minutes showed that the group continued working on the agenda for the face to face meeting to be held later in the month. They also cleared some letters sent through the <u>portal</u>. The results of all of the CRB rules changes can be seen here.
- > EVAC (7/10): Cancelled due to my vacation.

#### **SCCA Events:**

- > CRB (7/24-7/26): As this was after the announcement of changes being made, the next step was to delve deeper into the program's revisions. I went out a day early as a small group of the CRB would meet on 7/24 to discuss balance of performance (BoP) issues related to these revisions. It was a very productive meeting, and I was able to see how the process worked. The next day, the entire CRB would meet to hear the results of the previous day's discussions. The group also wrestled with more long term, strategic planning for the program. More will be announced on 8/15 when Eric has another webinar on the topic. On 7/26, they waded through more letters sent through the portal. I was not in attendance as I was required at the BoD meeting.
- > BoD (7/26, 7/27): This was a typical BoD meeting as we waded through A LOT of minutiae. Here are some bullet points in no particular order:
  - o Our financials look pretty good as we are slightly ahead of projections.
  - As mentioned before, the CRB is in the midst of making some large changes to the program. They updated the BoD on those changes. A shorter Runoffs, combined classes, fewer classes. We also discussed the location of the 2026 Runoffs.
  - The SEB had a few items for us to discuss. One the status of the CAM classes. They are also working on a rewrite
    of the Solo rules book.
  - A national convention date has been set (1/16-1/24). Once again, this will be a virtual convention. They will continue to support divisional conventions so we can expect some financial and personnel support for our meeting in Fort Wayne next spring.
  - Marketing has hired new personnel to expand its scope. The group is moving forward on the restructuring of the SCCA website. This would include a template for regional sites so they could be more easily maintained with less burden on the region.
  - We were updated about the various lawsuits against the Club as well as 'members behaving badly'.
  - We also had a load of super secret stuff which I am REALLY excited about but cannot share at this time. You folks will be SOOOOO impreseed when you hear the details.
